COVID 19 Surges & Mask Guidance Reminder



The LMLC Covid Task Force reminds you that masks are recommended but optional in our buildings and in worship for fully vaccinated/boosted persons; our kitchens remain closed. The Task Force continues to monitor virus spread and CDC guidance, and encourages our members to be fully vaccinated and boosted.

The CDC is warning that a new COVID variant is rapidly spreading across the USA; a recent news report stated that COVID-related hospitalizations in Roanoke are at their highest level since March 2022.

Masks and hand sanitizer are available in Fellowship Hall at the entrance, and in several locations in the Narthex. As Christians called by Christ to love our neighbor, we continue to mask and observe social distancing, particularly for the care of persons who are immuno-compromised or at high risk from prolonged side effects of the virus.

Discretionary Fund: Immediate Assistance for Persons in Need

Friends in Christ, I felt exceptionally called to pastor Luther Memorial because of this congregation's generosity to assist persons in need. The Social Ministry Committee works hard to identify area non-profit agencies whom we support with your donations on a rotating basis; our Good Shepherd Fund offers relief to persons in extreme hardship, after they complete an application process; we also make special appeals to you from time to time, and we give thanks for your support. The LMLC Discretionary Fund is our main source of immediate financial assistance to persons who call the church or reach out to me: we provide Kroger cards for gas, medicine or food, and this fund also helps with past-due utility bills. There is a high demand for assistance in our community as federal COVID relief expires. Please consider making a designated gift to the LMLC Discretionary Fund, so we may continue to relieve human suffering through Kroger cards and utility assistance. New Options for Holy Communion Distribution



Beginning Sunday July 31, we implemented a new distribution method for holy communion, based on requests from members and guidance from the COVID Task Force, the Worship & Music committee and Council. You are invited to commune in one of the following ways during Sunday morning worship:

- 1. Continue to use the pre-packaged communion cups available in the basket as you enter the sanctuary. Persons who choose this communion method will remain seated as usual; Pastor Monica will direct you to commune first, before inviting persons to come forward as described below.
- 2. Persons who wish to line up in the center aisle may do so and come forward to the altar to receive the bread from Pastor Monica, then take a glass cup of wine from trays offered by a Communion Assistant on the left and right sides of Pastor. After drinking the wine, participants will place their empty glass cups in trays on the tables to the right and left of the altar, before returning to the pews.

The glass cups will be washed each week in the church dishwasher for sanitization.

We need two Communion Assistants for each worship service. Please contact Marcia or Pastor Monica to volunteer. Robes are optional for Communion Assistant volunteers.

New Lay Ministry Fund for Persons in Vocational Discernment

Thanks to a generous donation by LMLC member Marjean Anthony, Luther Memorial may now provide financial assistance and support to lay persons who are discerning a call to vocational ministry. The Lay Ministry Fund will assist with tuition, fees and administrative expenses for persons in discernment, so they may attend Virginia Synod Vocation Retreats, enroll in the Lay Preaching Academy, and participate in the Candidacy process as appropriate. Synod Updates

Power in the Spirit Recap

Ten members of Luther Memorial plus Campus Pastor Rev. Libby Pfaff attended the Virginia Synod's Power in the Spirit gathering at Roanoke College in mid-July.



Pastor Monica served as a co-presenter for a workshop on Unconscious Bias, and attendees participated in additional workshops on Forgiveness, Women in John's Gospel and other topics. The keynote address was offered by 1517 Media (formerly Augsburg-Fortress Press) CEO Emeritus Beth Lewis, and we enjoyed a Bible study led by ELCA Pastor Rick Rouse. It was great to gather in person for meals, to renew friendships and meet fellow Lutherans.

Attendees also participated in a service project to provide clothing for persons experiencing homelessness through Micah's Street Church.

In 2023, the Virginia Synod will conduct its annual Assembly from June 9-11 to elect a new bishop, following the news that current Bishop Robert Humphrey will retire next year. Luther Memorial will send two voting members to the 2023 Assembly: please prayerfully consider representing our faith community at that important gathering.

New Exciting Program - Micah's Closet

The Social Ministry Committee is pleased to announce a new ministry opportunity called **Micah's Closet**. This program, started at St. Michaels Lutheran Church, buys a new set of fall and spring clothes for children who are in need at Prices Fork Elementary. We plan on adopting 20 children at Eastern Montgomery Elementary to expand the program. Micah's Closet works closely with the school staff and social workers to provide new clothing for identified children. The school staff or the social worker selects the

children who need clothes and provides the sizes. We never know who we are helping to protect the child.

We are asking for money to help buy the clothes for the children this fall. It cost about \$185 to provide a child with one week's worth of clothes. This includes 2 pairs of pants, 3 pair of shorts, 7 shirts, 5-10 pairs of underwear, a light jacket, and 1 pair of PJs. We need to raise \$3700 to sponsor the 20 children. We need your help for this worthy project. Donations can be made for Micah's Closet for August Change for Change, mailed to the church office or placed in the offering. Please note Micah's Closet on the memo line of your donation. Again, we would like to thank our fellow church members for all your support for the Social Ministry projects!
