A Word from Pastor Monica



In mid-October, I joined my fellow rostered clergy colleagues at the Virginia Synod Gathering of the Ministerium in Virginia Beach. Our keynote speaker was theologian Dr. Deanna Thompson, Professor at St Olaf College. Deanna led us in several insightful sessions over the course of three days, centered on this theme: "The Body of Christ has always been a Virtual Body."

Deanna's area of scholarship focuses on the use of digital technologies within faith communities, and their impact on participants in this ever-changing first-world culture where the practice of religion has become less of a priority in mainstream society. Deanna shared her own personal journey and battle with cancer: she is a brave survivor who speaks candidly about her challenges, and how they have influenced and affected her faith, particularly as a "PK," a Pastor's Kid who rejected technology, until she experienced the healing wishes sent to her by thousands of people over the virtual network, CaringBridge.org.

Deanna posed several intriguing questions to my rostered colleagues and I, as we reflect on our own use of technology during the pandemic and post-pandemic years. It was interesting to hear that while many of the Virginia Synod congregations now include some form of online or live-streamed worship, many continue to struggle to afford the equipment, gain access to dependable high-speed internet service, identify volunteers to edit and post the links or recordings, or convince their members that digital worship is indeed viable worship.

I appreciated Deanna's wisdom: ever since Christ's ascension into heaven, Christians have worshiped our Lord Jesus 'virtually.' We trust Jesus' promise that he is always with us, beside us, and alive in our hearts through our baptism, yet we can't see him; we can't touch him; we can't hear his voice or feel his loving embrace. Christ invites us to his holy supper every time we gather for worship, and we recite his own words to remind us that he is present, "Do this, in remembrance of me."

Yet ultimately, we depend on God's gift of faith to believe that Jesus is in our midst, 24/7. Jesus is indeed 'virtual' in terms of his physical presence, yet his boundless, unconditional love for us is real and tangible: we can feel Christ's love when we gather in worship; when we serve our neighbors in need; and when we pray.

In this season of gratitude, let's give thanks for the constant, undying, eternal presence, love and mercy given to us by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, in whom we place all our trust, all our hope, and all our love.

Readings are short enough to be used as daily devotions and the class will focus on the assigned readings for a week - <u>you may</u> download a copy of the calendar here.






Virginia Synod Tapestry Focus on Human Trafficking

The Synod's Tapestry team advocates for social justice for all God's people, by highlighting a different social justice focus each quarter. Tapestry's fourth-quarter focus is Women's Justice, as we seek to be aware of the issues and challenges that face women in America, and around the globe. Pastor Monica is a co-chair of Tapestry's emphasis on Women's Justice this year. Tapestry invites you to participate in this Women's Justice advocacy; in October, you may wish to visit the Tapestry webpage to learn about the evils of Human Trafficking. The Tapestry Team continues to provide information and resources about this threat to individuals, to families, to communities and to the global society. In November, Tapestry will present a Zoom Bible study on Women's Justice; in December, congregations may use a special Litany and Prayers on Women's Justice in their Advent worship services, and study a pre-recorded presentation on Human Trafficking authored by Sylvia Eley, board member of the Virginia Synod Women's Organization. - *From the Finance Committee: Adjustments to the proposed spending plan were made to reflect an increase to our VA Synod benevolence and step and cost of living increases for our pastors, office manager, and custodian. The proposed spending plan for 2023 will be considered at our annual congregational meeting on November 13th.
- *Installation of an electric line for The Little Hokie Hangout's new water heater has been completed. Bell Electric will install new LED lights in the hallway outside the restrooms on November 7th. The rest of the new flooring will be installed over winter break when the LHH will be closed for 2 weeks. Volunteers will be needed to move the furniture so this work can be completed.

November Change for Change - Christmas Outreach Christmas Outreach Will Kick Off the Fund Drive on November 13th

It's hard for me to realize that the Christmas Season is upon us. With that said, we will begin our Fund Drive for Christmas Outreach at our annual meeting on November 13th. The Christmas Outreach Project provides financial support for families who have children attending Valley Interfaith Child Care Center (VICCC). The goal of VICCC is to provide high-quality affordable, educational, and nurturing care for young children (ages 6 weeks to 5) of income-eligible working families in the New River Valley. The mission of VICCC is to provide support for the low-income working population of the New River Valley as they strive to become more self-sufficient. There is a significant barrier to low-income parents seeking to participate in the local job market. These parents may be left with a difficult choice. Without childcare, some parents are unable to hold a job, leaving them dependent on public assistance and unable to strive for their family's self-sufficiency. VICCC operates a licensed nonprofit childcare center that provided high-quality care at a subsidized price that our families can afford. VICCC parents can report to work knowing that their children are in a safe and loving environment where they will benefit from a curriculum that stresses literacy, self-esteem, and school readiness as well as a nutrition program tailored just for them. Instead of providing financial assistance to the center, Christmas Outreach focuses on the families.

In 2021, we had an extremely successful fundraising effort, and raised \$ 8,307.46. We were able to provide \$400 in financial support to 19 low-income families whose children attend VICCC. In addition, we were able to provide a couple of prepackaged snacks and one books for all 40 children who attend the center. VICCC also provides the same book each month to each child as part of their curriculum. We were able to provide 2 months of books for the center.

VICCC will soon identify the families for Christmas Outreach. We hope to help at least 20 families this year. The Department of Social Services has lowered the requirement to receive childcare assistance including paying the copay until the end of 2022. We will be giving financial assistance to each family instead of paying their copay. With the increase in cost of food, gas and other products, this help will be greatly appreciated to make this a Merry Christmas. I would like to challenge the congregation to raise \$8500 this year. That will allow us to give each family \$425 in financial support, provide two months of books to the center and provide a gift bag to each child in the center. Thank you for your support of Christmas Outreach. Our help means the world to these families. Peace, Teresa Cassell

To Our House Returns to LMLC

After two years at other venues, To Our House, the New River Valley hypothermia movable shelter, returns to our campus. However, we will not be hosting our traditional two weeks around Thanksgiving. Instead, we will be serving the first two weeks of January.



On the morning of Saturday December 31, we will accept the bedding supplies (tents, air mattresses, and linens) and do the set up at the Well. We will not entertain the guests that evening. We will begin providing meals and volunteers January 2.

There are many ways you may participate in this ministry:

SET UP: December 31 from 8:00 am - ? Receive items from the volunteers who hosted the previous week. Rearrange Campus Center furniture and set up small tents and bedding within them.

MEALS: Breakfast items will be purchased out of church funds. Gift cards will cover lunch. Please consider preparing a homemade evening meal and serving it. If you would like to prepare a meal but are unable to serve it, please indicate that in the comments. Possibly the evening volunteer may be able to serve it. Dinner at 5:30 pm. After the meal, please clean the area.

EVENING VOLUNTEER: One person an evening is needed to help make the guests feel welcomed, to help clean up from dinner, perhaps you may need to serve the meal, and to help the TOH staff if needed. Arrive at 5:00 pm. Leave 8:30 pm.

OVERNIGHT VOLUNTEER: Spend the night. You may sleep through most of it in a back room. Serve a quick breakfast at 5:30 am. Clean up. Arrive around 9:00 pm. Leave around 6:00 am.

LAUNDRY: Linens and towels will need to be laundered about 4 times. A large amount will need to be done at the very end of our weeks.

PACK UP AND CLEAN UP: Saturday Jan 14 early morning. All supplies need to be packed up and delivered to Glade Church. Campus Center needs to be cleaned and furniture returned to original positions.
