A Word from Pastor Monica



I imagine that if we took the time to count every single blessing God has provided to us, it would take many days and lots of pen and paper. God blesses us so richly, we may not even be mindful of every gift we receive, like the air we breathe, the sunshine, and the love of our families and friends.

Since ancient times, as the seasons change and Autumn approaches, God's people have harvested their crops, then stored those crops to be used for sustenance in the coming months, and celebrated God's rich abundance. Even though you may not grow crops or tend a garden, this season of the year invites you to 'measure the harvest' of God's generosity. How has God blessed you in 2022? What challenges and struggles did God bring you through, accompanying you every step of the way? How has your relationship with God been strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit, who stirs us to participate in the life of this faith community as we serve the world?

As a pastor, I measure many 'harvests': I thank God for the visitors who join us in worship and our Rainbow Connection gatherings; for all who partner with us to serve this community. I praise God for each of you, for your

faithful donations of time and money that make our ministry together possible. I glorify God for the many holy encounters I enjoy with you, as we worship, serve and fellowship together, united in Christ by our baptism. I thank God in Christ Jesus for my call to vocational ministry, that I may proclaim the Gospel's Good News to people who don't know that Jesus loves them. I'm thankful that I may comfort those who grieve; laugh with those who rejoice; and shine the light of Christ on the lost, the lonely and the desperate.

In Luke 12:48b, Jesus reminds us to support God's work, in gratitude for God's faithfulness: "From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required; and from one to whom much has been entrusted, even more will be demanded." Jesus asks us to consider how God has already blessed us with faith, knowledge, time, talents and treasures; Jesus invites us to reflect on what God has entrusted to us, that we may share those blessings with the world, to glorify God, relieve human suffering, and serve Christ.

You may have already received a draft of the proposed 2023 Ministry Funding Plan, in advance of the November 13th congregational vote on 2023 funding. I'm grateful for every Council member, committee chair, committee volunteer, and especially for our Finance team, for their dedicated preparation of this proposed plan. We face significant challenges in funding, and we need volunteers to participate in our growing ministries. How might you 'measure your harvest' and give back to God what God has first given you? We look to our future with joy, giving thanks to the Holy Trinity in confidence that our ministry together at Luther Memorial will continue to bear good fruit for Christ.

Council Votes to Resume Coffee Fellowship

At the recommendation of the COVID-19 Task Force, Council voted to resume coffee fellowship and reopen the church and campus center kitchens for use by members and outside groups, effective immediately. Kitchen use must be reserved in advance by contacting Office Manager Marcia Barrow; guidelines must be observed for proper sanitization and safety.



We will resume monthly Birthday Fellowship after

worship in the Narthex on the first Sunday of every month, beginning October 2nd. Please contact Marcia Barrow to host monthly Birthday Fellowship. Hosts are asked to provide food options for persons who are diabetic, vegetarian, and gluten/dairy-free. Instead of the Bunn coffee machine, we will use the church's regular coffee makers, plus an electric kettle for hot water/hot tea. Please use the paper goods stocked in the church kitchen, and notify Marcia if an item needs to be restocked.

Coffee fellowship after Sunday worship will be available on days when volunteers sign up to host; please contact Marcia if you'd like to host coffee fellowship on the second, third, or fourth Sunday of the month.


The Task Force made the following Motion to the LMLC Church Council on September 7, 2022, which Council approved by an email vote:


Recommendations

- Resume use of the kitchens in the church and in the Well campus center. Post the health
- department's guidelines for safe practices. Provide cleaning supplies.
- Announce this change to outside groups who use our buildings.
- Coffee fellowship and monthly birthday celebrations may resume, depending on availability of
- volunteers.
- Discontinue Pastor Monica's use of a glove for distribution of communion. Instead, Pastor and
- the communion assistants will use hand sanitizer. She and the assistants will wear masks during
- distribution, thus offering protection to communicants who remove masks at that time



Reformation Festival Worship on October 30th at 3pm





October Book Study - Beyond Shame

Luther Memorial, together with The Well and Edges, a progressive offshoot of Blacksburg United Methodist church, are co-sponsoring author Matthias Roberts who will hold a workshop in Blacksburg on October 29th (see more information below). Prior to the workshop, The Well, Luther Memorial, Edges and the Wesley Campus Ministry are offering a book study for three weeks in October.

Luther Memorial's book study on *Beyond Shame: Creating a Healthy Sex Life on Your Own Terms*, by Matthias Roberts will take place as follows in Fellowship Hall:

Psychotherapist Matthias Roberts helps readers overcome their shame around sex by overcoming three unhealthy coping mechanisms we use to manage that shame. Beyond Shame encourages each of us to determine our own definition of healthy sex, while avoiding the ditches of boundaryless sex positivity on the one hand and strict moralistic boundaries on the other. 
Virginia Synod Tapestry Focus on Human Trafficking

The Synod's Tapestry team advocates for social justice for all God's people, by highlighting a different social justice focus each quarter. Tapestry's fourth-quarter focus is Women's Justice, as we seek to be aware of the issues and challenges that face women in America, and around the globe. Pastor Monica is a co-chair of Tapestry's emphasis on Women's Justice this year. Tapestry invites you to participate in this Women's Justice advocacy; in October, you may wish to visit the Tapestry webpage to learn about the evils of Human Trafficking. Over the course of three months, Tapestry will provide information and resources about this threat to individuals, to families, to communities and to the global society. Each Sunday in October, Tapestry will offer a special devotion on the sin of Human Trafficking and its particular threat to women and girls. In November, Tapestry will present a Zoom Bible study on Women's Justice; in December, congregations may use a special Litany and Prayers on Women's Justice in their Advent worship services, and study a pre-recorded presentation on Human Trafficking authored by Sylvia Eley, board member of the Virginia Synod Women's Organization. - *From the Finance Committee: August was a good month! Work has been completed on a proposed spending plan for 2023 that will be considered at our congregational meeting on November 13th.
- *The Little Hokie Hangout upgrades are nearing completion. The new blinds were installed September 24th and Bell Electric will install new LED lights in the hallway outside the restrooms on November 7th. The rest of the new flooring will be installed over winter break when the LHH will be closed for 2 weeks. Volunteers will be needed to move the furniture so this work can be completed.

October Change for Change & To Our House Update - NOTE NEW DATES!

During the months of November-March, churches in Blacksburg and Christiansburg traditionally make space in their facilities to house 12-15 persons who experience homelessness, to provide them with hot meals, showers and a warm place to stay. Luther Memorial has participated in this program for many years, even during the pandemic as we faced new challenges on how to safely house and feed guests.

The To Our House board of directors has modified the program to better serve guests. As a result, LMLC will **NOT** host To Our House (TOH) in November, but we **WILL** provide our Campus Center facility to TOH guests from **Monday January 2 until Saturday January 14, 2023**. COVID-19 protocols will be observed, and the Campus Center will be 100% devoted to "To Our House", as Well students do not return for the Spring semester until January 17. As usual, LMLC will house the guests overnight; we will provide simple breakfast foods, lunches. and a hot dinner each evening. LMLC will also wash guest towels in the Well laundry facilities or with the assistance of our members. As our TOH hosting opportunity approaches, we will share more details and ask you to volunteer with this very important ministry.

Rainbow Connection Meets October 2 at 4 pm

The Rainbow Connection group will meet on October 2nd at 4 PM. Rainbow Connection gatherings are intended to be a safe space for LGBTQIA+ persons and allies to gather, socialize, network, and share their concerns. This intergenerational group is open to anyone in the Blacksburg area. Anyone over the age of 18 is welcome, and students and faculty from Virginia Tech are encouraged to participate. Seeking a New Home in Blacksburg

It's been a little over a year since the fall of Kabul and the takeover war-ravaged Afghanistan by the ultraright-wing Taliban. Thousands fled. (Thousands are still seeking ways out as they face recriminations, torture and even death at the hands of the Taliban.) Some who made it to the USA are in some phase of obtaining Special Immigrant Visas. These are individuals who worked with the Americans including members of the Afghan military. Others left because they were involved in activities that would put them in danger of

reprisals from the Taliban. They all seek asylum. Many from both categories came to Virginia. Many to Blacksburg. Since September 2021 twenty-two Afghan individuals have come to Blacksburg. In addition, a five-member family from Libya has recently arrived. All of these are receiving assistance from the all-volunteer <u>Blacksburg</u> <u>Refugee Partnership</u> (BRP).

BLACKSBURG REFUGEE PARTNERSHIP

The last several months I have been assisting one such family as they

adjust to a new culture. This family consists of a single mom who was a women's rights worker. She has her four children, ages 7-12, with her. She and others who arrived here at the same time, have been taking intensive English courses at VT Language and Culture Institute. And now my friend begins classes at New River Community College while still taking English lessons. She had an important trip to Charleston, WV in September to officially apply for asylum for herself and her children. It may take years before her application comes to a hearing.

There are teams of volunteers that assist not only this family, but the other families as well. There is help to get children registered for school and with other educational endeavors; everyone must have their vaccinations brought up to date. There are other medical and dental issues that need attention. Other areas of assistance are transportation, tutoring and finance education. Blacksburg Refugee Partnership provides financial assistance mostly in the form of rent. BRP is also busy seeking supporters, sponsors and grants. BRP was very fortunate to secured the pro bono services of an immigration law firm in Richmond.

There is much violence in this world that leads to a lot of displacement. Because of this, a few have found a new home in Blacksburg. They lost everything. BRP's mission is to help them transition to a new life. LMLC has been a supporter of BRP since its inception; there is a line item in our budget. And there have been many special fund drives that have met with generous response. Thanks to the generosity of our congregation, students were able to pick up a gift card and shopping list last Friday to shop for these clothes.

For several years now, the Food Pantry has given out an additional bag of groceries to be used for a holiday meal. This year Luther Memorial purchased 500 boxes of macaroni and cheese which have been delivered to the Pantry. The bags are packed in late October and will be given out starting November 1st.
