COVID Rates Rise in SW VA

The Virginia Department of Health cautions residents of SW Virginia that COVID-19 rates are increasing in our region, as well as across the country. A new COVID vaccine designed to treat the latest virus variant should be available in late September; boosters are strongly recommended by Virginia Dept of Health and the CDC, especially for persons with compromised immune systems and chronic medical conditions.

September Member Spotlight - Elizabeth Grant

I was born in Baltimore and baptized at Holy Comforter Lutheran Church (what a name)! I grew up in Towson (like Elaine Benes of Seinfeld) and went to Divinity Lutheran where I was in the children's choir. I headed to Virginia Tech for undergrad, where I attended Luther Memorial and was in the choir and the campus ministry group.





Shopping for Micah's Closet

Fall is in the air. School has started so that means that Micah's Closet is also ready to start the Fall Season Shopping. Micah's Closet provides one week's worth of new clothes to 25 elementary school children at Eastern Montgomery Elementary School. It is expected the cost of the clothes will not exceed \$185. The children are recommended by their teachers. If one child in the family is recommended, all the elementary age children are served. All the children's identities are confidential. We are recruiting shoppers. Each shopper is given a list of clothes to buy. Once purchased, shoppers can turn in their bags of clothes as well as their receipts for reimbursement. We expect to begin shopping around Sunday, September 10th and ask that all purchases
