
Our Living Faith Story

Retirement Announcement

It is with regret that we have received the notice of retirement of our Music Director, Sue Leblanc. We thank Sue for her many years of service and look forward to her continues presence in the choir. The following is a posting for the Music Director position. It is a September to May position in a non-coved year. The posting outlines the responsibilities of the position.

Job Posting

Posting: Position starting September 1, 2021

Job Title: Music Director

Job Statement: Provides leadership for the music of Trinity United Church. This person will work with our church family in accordance with our Mission Statement and offer support to the work of Trinity United Church.

Functions and Duties:

- Lead and direct the choir from September 1st until May 31st.
- Practice with choir Thursday evenings as well as for a short time Sunday morning (Sept. May)
- Participate in services with other churches as might come up
- Choose anthem music for Sundays (not necessarily every Sunday)
- Choose special music for Special Sundays
- Consult with the worship team and minister on hymn choices
- Track and report for copyright purposes all music used in services
- Ensure that music used is in accordance with the Copyright policy

Key Relationships: Ability to function as a team member working with the worship committee, the minister, choir members, other musicians and church staff.

Qualifications: Competent music skills on piano as well as good sight reading skills. Music in Voices United and More Voices is about the equivalent of RC Grade 5 level. Organ experience is appreciated but not necessary.

Accountability: To the Ministry and Personnel committee. A member of this committee will be assigned as a contact.

Remuneration: This is a contract position renewed each year and the person is paid on a monthly basis based. (\$286.00 /month for 9 Months) An invoice will be submitted to the church office each month worked and a cheque sent out at the end of each month.
