





Job Title: Music Director


Job Statement Provides leadership for the music of Trinity United Church. This person will work with our church family in accordance with our Mission Statement and offer support to the work of Trinity United Church.

Functions and Duties:

- Lead and direct the choir from September 1st until May 31st.
- Practice with choir Thursday evenings as well as for a short time Sunday morning (Sept. – May)
- Participate in services with other churches as might come up
- Choose anthem music for Sundays (not necessarily every Sunday)
- Choose special music for Special Sundays
- Consult with the worship team and minister on hymn choices
- Track and report for copyright purposes all music used in services
- Ensure that music used is in accordance with the Copyright policy

Key Relationships: Ability to function as a team member working with the worship committee, the minister, choir members, other musicians and church staff.

Statement of Support for the Indigenous Community at Laurentian University

From: CSRC Right Relations Resource Team

In 1986, at The United Church of Canada's General

Council meeting in Sudbury, Moderator Bob Smith offered the words of an apology on behalf of The United Church of Canada, to Indigenous peoples. To commemorate this important moment in history, and as a reminder of the work that is still to be done, a cairn was erected at the site, with permission from Laurentian University. Since then, the goal of living into reconciliation has been an important part of the work of The United Church of Canada.

We, as members of the Right Relations Resource Team within the Canadian Shield Regional Council of The United Church of Canada, would like to express our deep concern and anger at the restructuring and dismantling of the Indigenous Studies program at Laurentian University. As a people of faith who are committed to the work of reconciliation, we can not remain silent.

In an open letter to protect the Indigenous Studies program signed by over 1400 faculty, Indigenous community leaders and others it was stated that:

“The termination of the Indigenous Studies program in Sudbury at Laurentian would represent a significant turning away from Laurentian University’s Tri Cultural Mandate and its commitment to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission’s Calls to Action on Indigenous Education. It would have an immense impact on Indigenous communities and Canada and would represent the first Indigenous Studies program to be shuttered since the discipline began in 1969.”

The termination of such a program would be a further act of Colonization.
Please consider taking one of the Calls to Action included with this statement.

Calls to Action

Petition those in power:




