



Colorado District,



Power Surge 2023 - 2024 ANNUAL Event Report NYI Convention – June 22nd, 2024 One Hope Church of the Nazarene

August 2023

PowerSurge registration launched 2023 with early bird registration starting at \$148, early registration at \$158, and regular registration at \$175. To pay the deposit, a check had to be made out to "CO NYI" within 14 days, with the remaining balance to be paid at registration on location. The deposit for PowerSurge was paid on March 10th, totaling \$2765.00. The event featured workshops on Spiritual Formation, Bible Study Practices, Christian Worldview, Prayer, Dealing with Pornography, and addiction.

Pastor Cherie Reiter from The Connection Church lead the worship team, and Stephanie Gunstream, the Guest Relations Coordinator & Admissions Counselor from NNU spoke to prospective students. Pastor Jimmie Proffitt was extremely instrumental in the website's design and the event was a Holy Spirit-filled experience.

January 2024

On November 10th, 2023, over 300 NYI youth attended Power Surge 2023—The Secret Place at the YMCA of the Rockies. The event was a powerful experience, with the Holy Spirit poured down on the teens. The intercessory prayer service was particularly powerful, with teens praying over each other and their leaders. Following the service, workshops focused on discipleship and prayer were held, with positive feedback from the participants.

The worship team, including Pastor Cherie, Jarod Lowery, Nikki Nielsen, Pastor Brian, and Pastor Daniel, was praised for their Holy Spirit-powered worship. Pastor Div's sermon on The Secret Place was particularly powerful, emphasizing the importance of prayer and spending time talking to God. The event was a success, but there were areas for improvement.

The gym was taken over by a karate tournament, and the gym was only available for the kids. The workshop setup could be improved by having other pastors bring audio/visual equipment, but the YMCA IT department would handle this. The pastors should emphasize the importance of workshops as much as worship services, and next year, there will only be a middle school and high school track.

In summary, Power Surge 2023 was a successful event, but there are areas for improvement.

I would like to thank all the workshop instructors: Pastor Jimmie for the prayer service, Pastor Div, Pastor Cherie and the band, and Pastor Craig for doing the games and activities.

For this year's PowerSurge, I have asked Pastor Jeb Bunn to be our speaker, who is the senior pastor at Pasco Church of the Nazarene in Washington. He has accepted the invitation after a week of prayer and meditation.

April 2024

Power Surge 2024 is set to launch registration on August 5th, 2024, and will be advertised at the NYI Convention and Teen Camp. Reverend Jeb Bunn will be the speaker, and the theme is Called Unto Holiness, which aligns with the church's theme of Blessing Your Community. The event will feature workshops such as "What Drives You?" "Repost Evangelism," "Living a Life of Holiness as a Teen," and "Repost Evangelism." Returning instructors include Keith Morgan of True Life, Ed Belzer and Jon Wilhite of Aurora Tower, and Gary Haddix of Greeley Celebration. More commitments are expected, and young adults will have their own set of events with Briana and Jacob Newell.

NYI ANNUAL QUIZZING REPORT 2023-2024 June 22nd, 2024 One Hope Church of the Nazarene

August 2023

The time came again for our students to put on the Full Armor of God and study their Word as they prepared for the quizzing season (Ephesians 6:10-17). The 2023 -2024 season was posted and sent out on August 9th, 2023. It is available and posted on the <u>Colorado District Website</u>, <u>the Colorado Nyi website</u>, and the <u>Western Slope Quiz League Facebook Page</u>.

The Books of the Bible that were studied this year were the Epistles of the Apostle Paul: Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon.

All churches were invited to these meets for this season, but all meets were held at either Cortez or Durango for the 2023–2024 season. We have also invited other churches in the Four Corners area that would like to participate as well. Our first meeting was at Durango Faith Community on Saturday, November 18th, 2023, and the teens quizzed on the books of Galatians, Ephesians, and Philippians.

January 2024

The Western Slope Quiz Meet kicked off on Saturday, November 18th, with the Paul's Missionary Journey Meet that was hosted at Durango Faith Community with about 12 quizzers who came to compete from Durango Faith Community and Cortez Church of the Nazarene. This was followed by THE PHILLIPI MEET, which was hosted by Cortez Church of the Nazarene on December 9th for the first afternoon meet that began at 1 p.m.

For the start of the year, we began with our Quiz Camp II at Cortez Church of the Nazarene with nine participants from Cortez and Durango that were led by Pastor Janelle. The clinic was a great time to immerse themselves in scripture and techniques to finish the quiz season.

With two regular season meets left this season and the championship in April, the competition is tighter this year than ever. The records are close, and the host of the championship is anyone's game.

I also had a Northwest District Quiz Directors Meeting with Mr. William Buckholdt at the Field Finals in May and had a chance to meet with other quiz directors in the regions. This will get the creative juices flowing about the possibility of sending quizzers from Colorado this year.

April 2024

The Western Slope Quiz League had their final two regular season meets in February with the **COLOSSAE & PHILEMON MEET** that was held at Cortez Church of the Nazarene. Then, the action continued March 30th as we closed out the season at Durango Faith Community Church with Paul's Epistles Meeting. Now, based on the cumulative score, Durango Thunderclap is at **427.5** and Cortez Echo is at **348.33**. I remember sitting in a new office during my very first week as a young adult pastor and replaying the words that had been spoken to me just days prior: "Young adults aren't looking for youth group 2.0." As a veteran youth pastor of almost 20 years who came into the job with a portfolio of games, events, small group strategies, and creative messages, that statement left me wondering, "What exactly *are* young adults looking for?" What I've learned over the past few years is that young adults aren't looking for an amazing program custombuilt for them but rather they are searching for spaces where they can discover their identity, purpose, and belonging, all while navigating challenges they are facing daily.

While I've not discovered any "one-size-fits-all" model for young adult ministry, I do believe that we can find creative ways to engage the young adults in the context in which we find ourselves ministering. Here are three ways to start.

What I've learned over the past few years is that young adults aren't looking for an amazing program custom-built for them but rather they are searching for spaces where they can discover their identity, purpose, and belonging, all while navigating challenges they are facing daily.

1. Find Ways to Leverage Stories: "Story House"

Most of us can look back to a moment in time when we heard a story that had a profound impact on our life. Stories can shape our perspectives, cause us to ask deeper questions, and help form the human connection that we long for. When it comes to engaging young adults, leveraging stories can create an avenue to do this. In our own ministry, we run a young adult gathering called "Story House." Each month, we transform a space into a living room type setting equipped with a coffee bar and specialty snacks. We invite a story teller into the space—usually someone of an older generation—and ask them to share a story from their life that has to do with identity, belonging, or purpose. After they share, we break into groups and talk through questions that have to do with elements of the story. What we've found is that, not only do we have some incredible conversations, but we also find pieces of ourselves in each other's stories. This fosters spiritual growth among our young adults and develops a deeper sense of community intergenerationally.

2. Create a Unique Space to Connect: "Space in Between"

Young adults often show up in our churches on Sunday mornings but then walk out without ever having a conversation with anyone. They long for community, but they often struggle with where and how to create that. The church can help build bridges between young adults by providing unique and simple spaces to connect. One way that has worked for us is offering our "Space in Between" on Sunday mornings. We open a room off the main lobby that is designated for young adults only. In between services, we offer a coffee bar, bagels, hot waffle buns, and fruit. The goal is to look for young adults coming in and out of our building and invite them into the space to meet other young adults. There is no program, Bible study, or timeframe in which they need to stay. It's simply a VIP room for young adults to meet our young adult leadership and connect with others their age.

3. Keep It Simple: "Connect Dinners"

Most young adult ministries consist of a range of ages, stages of life, and spiritual journeys. It can feel like a daunting task to create a program, event, or small group where everyone uniquely finds their place. What makes it even more challenging is when the young adults we meet with connect with us as leaders, but aren't necessarily finding community in the church at large. As

leaders, we don't have the capacity to stay closely connected and disciple every person we meet.

Luckily, we don't have to overcomplicate things to find a solution to this. It can be as simple as inviting 6-8 young adults into your home and hosting a "Connect Dinner." Our goal at our connection dinners is to find a few young adults who may have something in common and get them all around the table at the same time. We keep the food simple, several of our young adult ministry team members are present, and we simply facilitate conversation. Those dinners have sparked deeper spiritual friendship that young adults continue to pursue on their own.

Every ministry context is different, but one thing is sure—there are young adults in every community desperate to find purpose, trying to understand who they are, and searching for a place to belong. Let's not settle for youth group 2.0; instead, let's creatively find ways to come alongside.


