Nights of Comforting Care

Our 3-bedroom hospice provided over 1,000 nights of comfortable care to our residents.



In Savings

In 2023, over 120 people who could no longer be cared for at home bypassed hospital admission and went straight to Hill House or came from the hospital enabling a realized savings of over \$1M in hospital costs and better health outcomes.



Occupancy Rate

In 2023, Hill House realized a +100% occupancy rate.



People Supported

Hill House Hospice directly supported over 600 people in 2023. This includes residents who stayed with us and their families.



Families Cared For

In 2023, over 120 families received compassionate and expert hospice care at no cost at Hill House Hospice.

2024-2025 Strategic Direction

We remain committed to our strategic goal of expanding our hospice home to better serve the needs of our community. In addition to expanding our physical space, we have actively worked to grow, cultivate, and nurture relationships with community partners, stakeholders, and families. Our focus is not just on growing larger but on expanding in a way that aligns with the needs of those we serve.



Campaign Milestones & Updates

In 2023, we entered the quiet phase of our campaign and conducted a comprehensive feasibility study to determine whether our current location at 36 Wright Street could accommodate a new 12-bedroom hospice. We received key endorsements from stakeholders, including Western YR Ontario Health Teams, Mackenzie Health, Reena, Hope House Community Hospice, Richmond Hill Mayor David West, and MPP Daisy Wai.



In January 2024, we presented our financial strategy as part of the budget consultation process with the Ministry of Finance. The following month, we announced the selection of NEO Architecture Inc. as the project architects. Their experience in hospice construction, including their work on the Gies Family Centre Hospice in Waterloo, makes them an ideal choice for this project.

By March 2024, we successfully submitted our budget and application to the Ministry of Health, marking a significant milestone in our expansion efforts.


Dear Hill House Hospice Team,


Total Revenue
