When Pooran Ramlakhan was diagnosed with glioblastoma, an aggressive brain cancer, it curbed his ability for adventure – but not his infallible spirit. After hard months spent battling the disease's progression, Pooran came to Hill House Hospice.

Pooran's daughter Sarita recalls the many relatives who visited him with a laugh. **"We were always made to feel welcome at Hill House," she reflects. "If we wanted to spend the night, we could spend the night."**

Being with his family is what brought Pooran the most joy as Hill House staff did everything possible to keep him comfortable.

As Sarita speaks of her father, she remembers a man who loved Hallmark romance movies and cracking corny jokes. Pooran spent a lot of time in the garden and bird-watching, as well as playing word games.

"Hill House ensured he could still enjoy the things he loved," Sarita says. Staff angled Pooran's bed to face the garden, and he would watch the birds each morning as he ate his breakfast.

Because of YOU, Sarita's family was able to make the most of their final days with their beloved father, husband, brother, and uncle.

After months spent managing Pooran's diabetes, Sarita describes the relief she felt when Hill House staff reassured her they had his diet well in hand. They brought him fresh mangoes, reminiscent of Trinidad where he'd grown up as one of 15 children.

When Pooran died, he was surrounded by love. "We couldn't have asked for a better way for him to leave this world," Sarita shares. "It was the most beautiful way for it to happen."

YOU make hospice care accessible





Elaine Gold remembers her mother Ann Gold, Hill House Hospice's founder

"Harry D. L. Hill was a local businessman whose original 1950s childhood home is now Hill House Hospice. It was our mother, the late Ann Gold, who took Hill House from an abstract idea to a bricks-and-mortar reality when the town of Richmond Hill agreed to lease the home for hospice care in 1998.

Working as a nurse, our mother Ann was a passionate palliative care advocate. She was a pioneer who had the insight to see the need in the community. She felt there were always people with life-limiting illnesses who required

a special place because they were alone, had no caregivers or just couldn't stay home. A home-like setting would be much more preferred than a hospital.

Our mother's credibility as an activist, a community volunteer and a fundraiser, coupled with her love of people, determination and persuasive personality, allowed for the creation of the hospice. Hill House Hospice was born from her vision of bringing hospice care to Richmond Hill."
