

When 77-year-old Kathy Luciano was told she no longer had a bed in the hospital where she was receiving palliative care, her grandchildren panicked.

"There was a lot we needed to know," recalls granddaughter Miranda. "How much oxygen was she using per hour? What were her medications? Were they going to provide them? Did we need to look into prescriptions? The hospital staff couldn't tell us. They had no answers."

Miranda and her brother Adam were already struggling to balance navigating the healthcare system on Kathy's behalf while working full-time.

Now, they needed to find her a suitable place to live – and ensure she could get the medical attention she needed.

Thanks to YOUR generosity, the family found peace of mind at Hill House Hospice.

"The biggest advantage of Hill House is I get to be her granddaughter again," says Miranda. I don't have to be her nurse. I don't have to be her personal support worker. I can just be her granddaughter again, which I hadn't been able to do while she was in the hospital."

Adam echoes his sister's thoughts. "It's just like a weight's been lifted," he explains. "Now I know she's being taken care of. There's always somebody around."

Kathy is grateful for the personalized care she receives from the staff. "I have connected

with everybody that I deal with. I'm not a number. I feel like a princess!"

Because of YOU, Kathy is able to enjoy her final days to the fullest.

"Life is about living," she says.
"Hill House gives you your life back. You can't look at it as 'this is a place to die' because that's not the truth. It's a place to live. Hill House is full of life."

A MESSAGE FROM ARNIE WARNER


A hospice enriches the entire community by providing essential support during life's most challenging moments. It creates a compassionate space where individuals and families can find comfort, dignity, and care.
