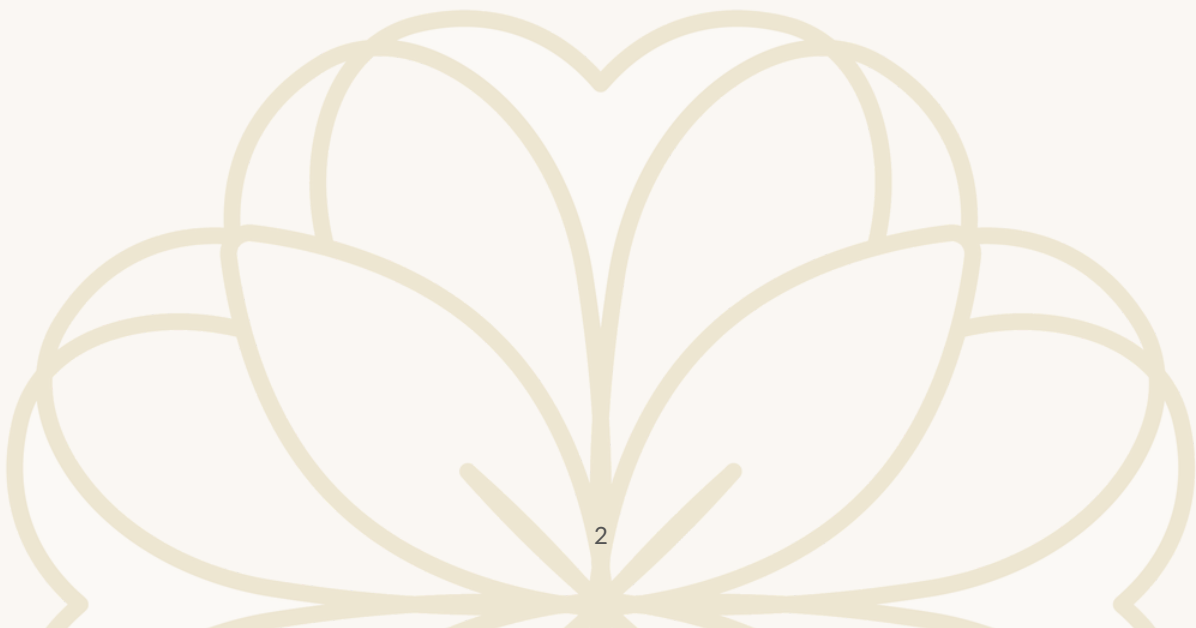



## OUR HOME

For 28 years, our little red-brick bungalow on a quiet street in Richmond Hill has offered comfort and medical care to residents in their final weeks of life, as well as support to their families. It is a home-like alternative to institutional and in-home care, and all services are provided free of charge. Hill House is a special place filled with love, hugs, laughter, and tears.

We operate with a high staff-to-resident ratio, with at least one nurse and one personal support worker (PSW) on duty day and night for every three residents—exceeding the current staffing model of most other hospices in the Greater Toronto Area. Looking beyond the traditional medical approach, we also incorporate a variety of alternative therapies to promote holistic wellness.

Hill House sits on a one-acre lot and, in addition to its three bedrooms, features a fully equipped kitchen, a large living room, and a dining room. The beautiful gardens and landscaping are maintained by the Richmond Hill Garden and Horticultural Society, as well as the City of Richmond Hill.

# THE HILL HOUSE HOSPICE DIFFERENCE

Hill House Hospice is a special place filled with love. It was the first hospice residence in York Region and the second in the province of Ontario. Hill House is also a registered charity.

Since our founding in 1998, our goal has been to lead by example, serving as a model for exemplary residential care in York Region and across Canada.

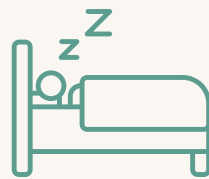

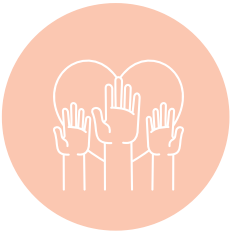
## INTERNAL SYSTEM CAPACITY

## RESIDENT LEGACY PROGRAM

The Resident Legacy Program has been in development. Training for this initiative included specialized education sessions and interactive workshops facilitated by another hospice that operates a well-established model. The resulting program will offer residents an opportunity to reflect, create, and share meaningful expressions of their life stories. Legacy work can be profoundly healing for individuals nearing end of life, as well as for their loved ones and caregivers who accompany them through this journey.



## VOLUNTEER PROGRAM EXPANSION

This year, we expanded our volunteer program by creating a dedicated Grief & Bereavement Team to offer additional emotional support to residents and their families. With specialized training beyond standard HPCO education, these volunteers provide bedside and follow-up support, and help families access ongoing community resources.

## RESIDENT'S STORY

### A DAUGHTER'S TRIBUTE

When Chrissie Ling reflects on her mother, Relita—affectionately known as “Momma Ling”—she describes her as a guiding light: remarkable, welcoming, stylish, and spunky. Born in the Philippines in 1942, Relita’s life was shaped early by resilience. After losing her father in World War II, she became a caregiver to her nine siblings, working alongside her mother and aunt to support the family. Even in hardship, she radiated beauty, laughter, and love.

In 1967, Relita immigrated to Canada, seeking better opportunities for her family. A year later, she met her future husband at church in Saskatoon. They married on Christmas Day and built a life filled with love, raising three children and later welcoming five grandchildren. Her pride in her family was unwavering, and her magnetic energy made her a beloved figure in every room she entered.

Relita’s later years were marked by health challenges, including painful arthritis and a stomach cancer diagnosis in 2020, which she bravely overcame. But in the summer of 2024, she was diagnosed with stage 4 kidney failure. Tired from years of battling illness, she expressed her wish to rest, and the family began palliative care at home.

“There were no visiting hours,” Chrissie recalls. “If we needed anything, we just had to ask. It was so accommodating and so not what I expected.”

As her condition worsened, the emotional and physical toll on the family grew. In November, her palliative care doctor recommended Hill House Hospice. Unfamiliar with hospice care, Chrissie and her family were apprehensive. But upon arrival, they were met not with the sterile environment they feared, but with warmth, comfort, and compassion.

Relita’s vibrant spirit filled the hospice. She quickly formed deep bonds with the staff—nurses, PSWs, and volunteers—who treated her not just as a patient, but as family. Her room echoed with laughter, music, and stories, and was always stocked with her favorite snacks: A&W, Taco Bell, and Crunchy Cheetos, shared during weekend sleepovers with Chrissie.

One volunteer, Goutami, became especially close to Relita. Knowing she hoped to hold on until Christmas—her 56th wedding anniversary—Goutami helped organize a special celebration the day before. She prepared a rack of lamb dinner with candles and champagne, even shaping tomatoes into hearts. With help from Gina and Nimar, they styled Relita’s hair and makeup, creating a beautiful moment of joy and dignity.

Miraculously, Relita made it to Christmas. The Hill House team catered a festive dinner, and the family gathered around the table for one last celebration, with Relita in her favorite red sweater. “For the first time in months, we didn’t have to be caregivers,” Chrissie says. “I could be a daughter. My dad could be a husband. My brother could be a son.”

Hill House Hospice gave the Ling family the gift of presence—of being together without the burden of care. It was a place not just for final days, but for meaningful moments, for laughter, for love. “We will forever be grateful to have this hospice in our community,” Chrissie shares. “Thank you, Hill House, for giving my mom the chance to live her final days with quality and dignity.”

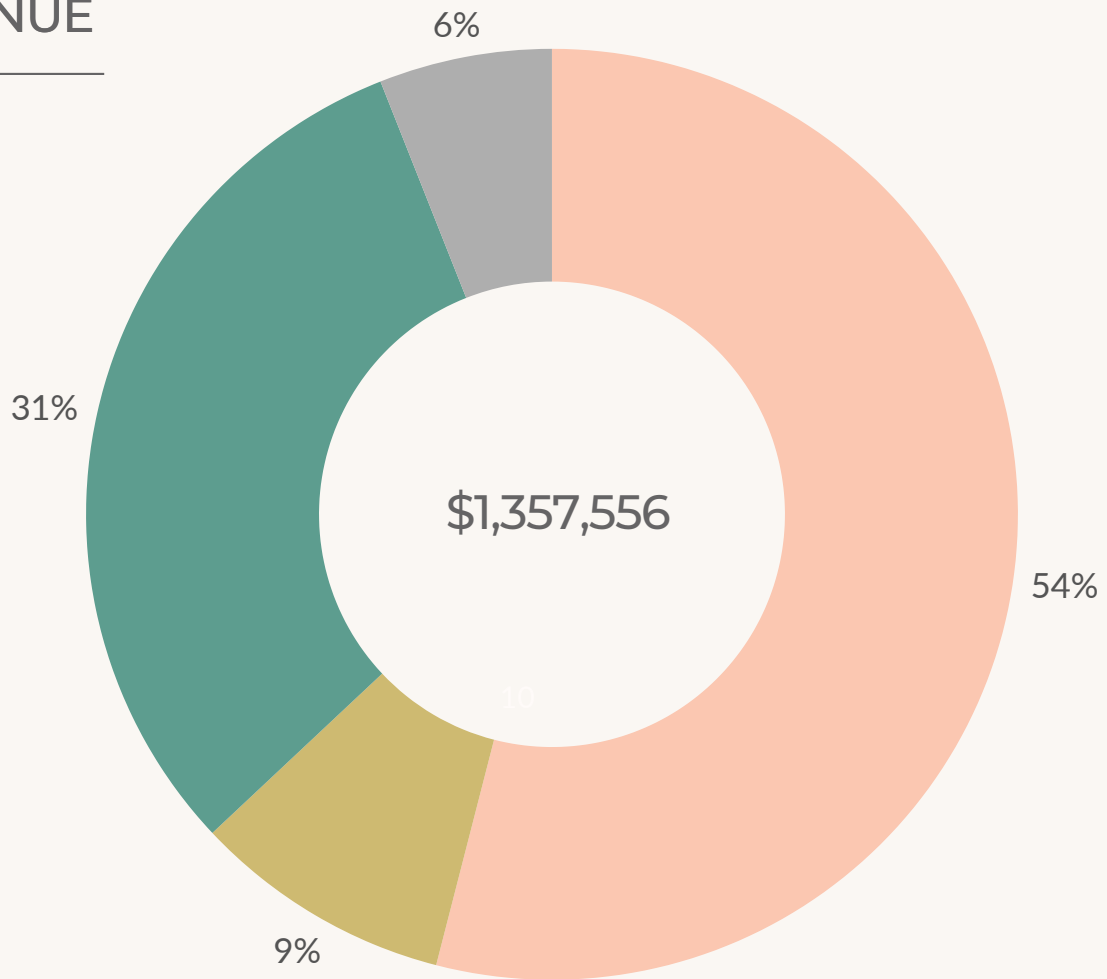

# 2024 - 2025 FINACIAL REPORT

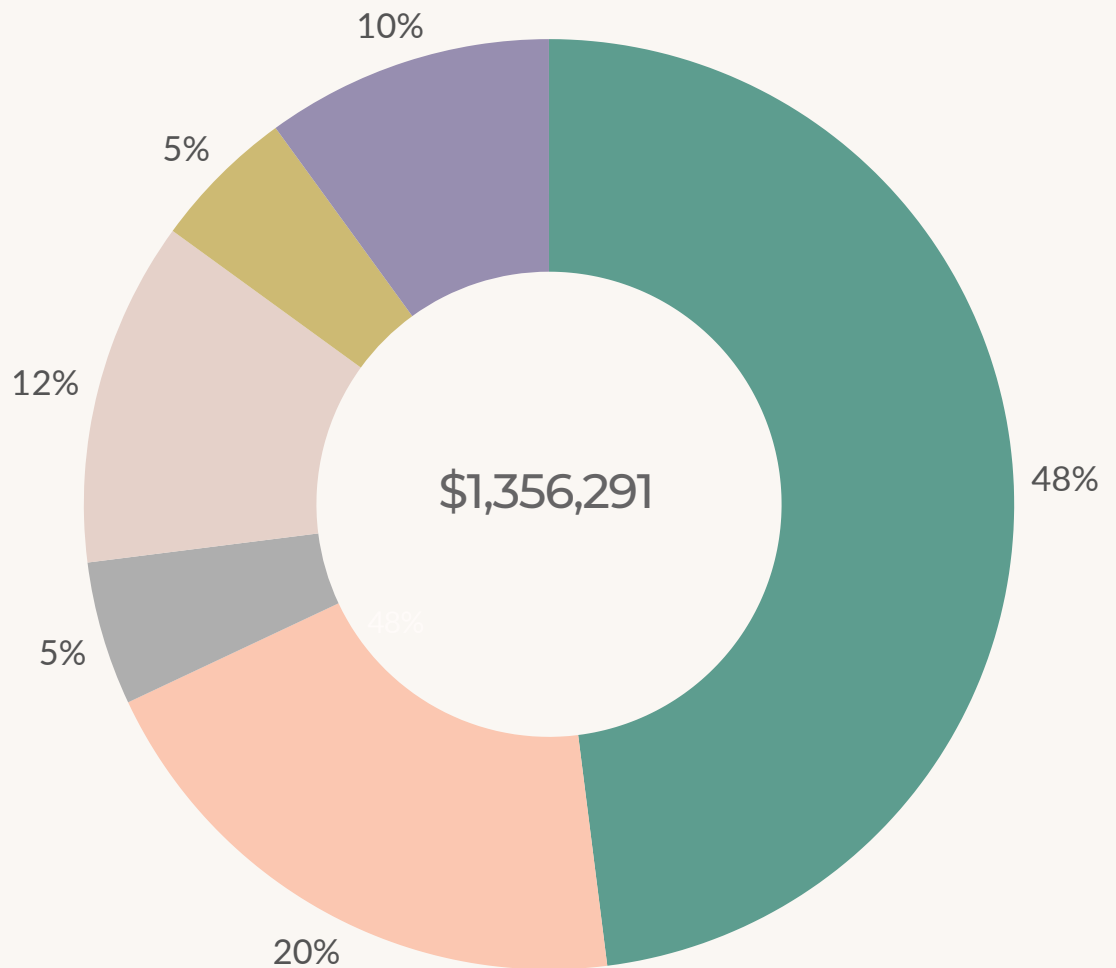
## REVENUE

FY2024 had a small excess between operating revenues and expenses.
