Thank you for expressing an interest in applying to work within the St Ralph Sherwin Catholic Multi-Academy Trust (CMAT). As CEO, I want to provide you with an introduction to our Trust and to give you a flavour of what working within our Trust would be like.

Saint John Houghton Catholic Voluntary Academy opened as The Blessed John Houghton Catholic School in 1965 offering a Christian education, where prayer, worship and liturgy are integral parts of our daily life. We aspire:

Saint John Houghton is a wonderful school for teachers and learners alike. We are rooted in a rich local tradition and celebrate our heritage each year by participating in the Beauvale Pilgrimage. We are also forward looking and constantly seeking to develop all aspects of provision and experience for our students. We provide an outstanding curriculum, one which is carefully planned and consistently reviewed to meet the needs of the all our students. Our staff are passionate about our school community and committed to the growth and development of all colleagues and students. The students enjoy academic challenge and appreciate positive relationships with their teachers. They are reflective learners and engage wholeheartedly with the broader aspects of school life in relation to for example, social justice issues and service towards others. We are a welcoming and happy community and the work of all members of our school community is founded in the context of the School Mission Statement. About the Faculty

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Saint John Houghton Catholic Voluntary Academy The Art, Design and Technology Faculty

Over the past few years, every element of the Art, Design and Technology Faculty has undergone a huge amount of change to ensure that we are providing our students with the best chance to reach their potential. The Faculty is always pushing for improvement and the new member of the team will play a vital role in bringing their thoughts and ideas to contribute to making this happen. It is vital that the new member of the Faculty appreciates the work that has already been done and adopts the strategies that the Faculty has already put in place.

Staffing structure

The Art, Design and Technology Faculty have five hardworking, forward thinking and passionate teachers who are determined to provide a challenging and stimulating environment for our students at Saint John Houghton Voluntary Catholic Academy. To support all of our planned activities we have two technicians and a number of TA's that regularly work within the Faculty at both KS3 and KS4.

Range of subjects

Art, Design and Technology is a popular choice for students and the curriculum has been tailored to be exciting and interesting for all those students taking part. At KS3 we try not to categorise subjects but instead deliver projects through a set design brief allowing students to draw upon previous experience to solve the problem. We are very keen on mixing material areas and have a more holistic approach to the delivery of Design and Technology. Students are given two hours of Design and Technology a week and we operate a carousel system so that students get the chance to develop their skills with a range of different challenges.

At KS4 we have a range of Design and Technology subjects offered as optional subjects. Students taking a Design and Technology will do so in Years 10 and 11. There is a high demand for all of our subjects within Faculty with around 70% of students opting to take an Art or Design and Technology GCSE. We currently offer GCSE's in Engineering, Food Preparation & Nutrition, Design & Technology and Art & Design. In some of these subjects where numbers are high we offer a carousel system similar to KS3 that allows teachers to share a GCSE group.

Facilities

The Design and Technology Faculty has had significant investment over recent years to ensure the success of the subject continues. The Food room is fully equipped to meet the needs of the current curriculum. We also have a dedicated D&T ICT suite with 22 computers that can be used by the entire Faculty with prior arrangement. The Faculty has a design suite which contains 14 computers, laser cutter, vinyl cutter, milling machine, colour printer and A3 scanner. The Textiles room has been fully equipped with a CNC embroidery machine, 12 computers and sewing machines to ensure that we offer a creative and versatile environment.

Exam statistics

As a Faculty we have been keen for Design and Technology to shift away from traditional methods of teaching which has seen Resistant Materials and Textiles being combined into Design & Technology with great success. In recent years we have altered the way in which GCSE's are delivered and opted for GCSE groups to be shared by more than one teacher. This has improved the way that Design and Technology GCSE's have been delivered by allowing healthy conversation and best practice to be shared. The Faculty can typically expect to attain 75% - 80% level 4's from Design and Technology subjects at GCSE with our 7+ levels around 20%.
