


Overview


The San Xavier Allottees Association, Inc. (SXAA), was established in 1991 as a nonprofit organization receiving our 501(c)3 status through the State of Arizona with Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws to support.

History

The development of the association was to defend and protect the land and water rights of the Tohono O'odham allotment owners. Several large companies such as real estate companies attempted to exploit the landowners by offering the allottees an unjust amount to lease their land. In order to combat the injustice, the Defenders of O'odham Land Rights were established as an organization, which eventually evolved into the San Xavier Allottees Association, Inc. Throughout the inception of this organization we continue to be a supporter of Allottees land and water rights.

MISSION


"To assist San Xavier allottees to preserve, improve their land and to educate them on water rights, environmental protection, and economic development."


Combined (2x) B of A Checking Accounts as of 8/17/2022
