

Wheatbelt Data Useage (as of June 2024)



The average WA home/business on the nbn network used 461.65 GB per month over the last year, slightly higher than the national average.

The average monthly data usage across the Wheatbelt was considerably lower at around 222.1 GB.

Top 5 data hungry LGAs: Northam – 479.46, Merredin – 405.57 and Narrogin – 387.72, Chittering – 386.84, Kellerberrin – 373.69

The Shire of Northam had the biggest increase (21.1%) in data usage over the last year across all of WA.





Network Upgrades – Fibre Expansion









9.4 million homes and businesses (82% of fixed-line network) now eligible for neargigabit speeds.

On track to complete upgrades that will enable 3.5 million homes and businesses served by Fibre to the Node and 1.5 million premises served by Fibre to the Curb to upgrade to Fibre to the Premises by the end of December 2025.

New commitment: All remaining FTTN premises will have an upgrade path (approx. 95% to fibre) by 2030, benefiting 622,000 homes and businesses—over half in regional Australia.

Fixed Wireless & Satellite Enhancements





Fixed Wireless Expansion: 800,000 premises now have access to faster speeds (equipment upgrade may be required).

Approx 90% of Fixed
Wireless users can access
potential maximum
wholesale download
speeds of 200-250 Mbps.

Approx 80% can access potential maximum wholesale download speeds of up to 400 Mbps.




