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







Strategic Partnerships

The Year 9 Career Taster Program inspires secondary school students to become 'career curious' about further study options and potential careers.


Flexible program that supports schools to tailor the program to students' needs and interests and regional opportunities.

TAFE Colleges have coordinators at main campuses and provide career taster experiences in collaboration with local industry and other stakeholders.


Industry partners provide experiences directly to a school or in collaboration with a TAFE college.

- Mentoring and career speed-dating and camps



- To minimise workforce disruption and maximise opportunities for workers


Challenges

- Significant investment across a wide range of activities related to clean energy technology and the electrification of houses, vehicles, resources and industries
- Some of the technology is evolving rapidly, with time-limited global opportunities as well as competition, e.g. hydrogen and green steel
- Investment in relevant training facilities to develop the pipeline of workers on a just-in-time basis
- Integration of schools, STEM, hybrid articulation across VET / university
- Industry-led training / teachers / curriculum development
- Quality and scale of existing facilities already under pressure, especially electrical
