



His Masterpiece: Jars of Clay

The U.S. national Alliance Women leadership team has come up with a new theme—*His Masterpiece:* Jars of Clay—for the 2025–2026 year. One of the tools we wanted to put into your hands to use with women in the local church is monthly devotionals to go along with this theme. These devotionals can be used individually or with a group.

Each devotional starts with an opening question for discussion, followed by the devotional. At the end of each devotional, you will find two to three discussion questions that can be used with the group, with the hope is that it will trigger further discussion. We have also added a closing prayer.

Our desire is that you and the women in your church would be blessed and encouraged to draw close to the Lord as you work through these devotionals. God has chosen to work through His people who are often sinful, weak, and imperfect clay pots. However, when we step aside and allow Him to work through us, we point others to His glory and draw people to Him.

We hope these devotionals will be helpful to you as you go through them. May we all shine His light through our cracks!



A Sculptured Life

Do you ever feel like you don't measure up to the standard that God has for you and that He cannot use you?

I have a vision for my life and how it will look. In my mental picture, I have a wonderful life—one in which I am serving the Lord, being a wonderful wife and mother, a loving friend, and an on-fire ministry leader. Sure, I mess up now and then, but overall, my life looks pretty good and much like a beautiful sculpture.

However, my reality often seems far different than the picture in my head. I am short with my husband. My adult children have walked away from the faith and that causes me a great deal of anxiousness. I get tired of being "on call" for ministry. I sometimes have a bad attitude and very little in my life is picture-perfect. In fact, I often wonder how God can use such a flawed person to do anything in His Kingdom. It leaves me feeling a bit deflated.

The prophet Isaiah laments about this same thing in Isaiah 64. In fact, he reminds God of how sinful the Israelites actually can be. In verse six, he says that even their righteous acts are like filthy menstrual cloths, despicable and disgusting in the Lord's eyes. They don't measure up to the holiness of God.

But then he goes on to remind the Lord of the depth of their relationship with Him:

"Yet Lord, You are our Father; we are the clay, and You are our potter; we all are the work of Your hands." —Isaiah 64:8, HCSB

He calls God "Father" and tells Him that they are like pieces of clay in a potter's hands. He implores the Lord to look with compassion on His people and remember His love for them.

Your life is a sculpture that is being shaped by the Lord. He is working with a piece of clay that is sometimes difficult and misshapen. At other times, it is cracked and dry. And yet, God never gives up on it. He lovingly and painstakingly molds you into a woman that can be used by Him, despite your flaws and frailties. God can create something beautiful even from imperfections and can transform individuals according to His will.

My life is not perfect, nor is yours. Yet, when we allow Him to do so, the Lord molds us and sculpts us into a beautiful jar of clay that can be useful. We will fulfill our highest purpose when we allow the Potter to have His way with us.

Discussion Questions:

How have you seen God working in you despite your imperfections?

Do you tend to make excuses for your imperfections, or do you view your sin or frailty as God does? How do you view the imperfections of others?

What needs to happen for you to become pliable clay in the Potter's hands?

Closing Prayer:

Heavenly Father, we come before You with our imperfect, sinful, and flawed life. Please help us to be pliable clay in Your hands. Mold us and conform us into Your image. Work in us to soften those areas that need softening and to turn our life into a beautiful clay jar that can be used by You to further Your Kingdom. Amen.
