Mary, Molded to His Will

Who am I? In what way will you describe yourself in relation to your relationship with God?

Example: "Who am I? I am a believer! I am a woman who keeps on believing in God every day of my life because His promises are true and His commands are good" (God's Heart, My Heart by Theresa Huculak).

Read: Luke 1: 26-38

Luke 1:26–38 tells us that the angel appeared to Mary and told her that she was highly favored, and she will give birth to the Son of the Most High God—whom she will call Jesus. Though Mary was afraid, she humbly said, "I am the Lord's servant" (Luke 1:38). Knowing that God had given her a calling to obey, she listened and trusted His will for her.

Mary modeled the three characteristics of doing the will of the Father:

A listening heart: "I will surrender"

In verse 28, Gabriel greeted Mary by calling her favored and saying the Lord is with her. Despite being engaged to Joseph, feeling troubled, and trying to discern the greetings of the angel, she was willing to listen to the Word of the Lord as to why she was favored. The angel responded that she would bear the Messiah, Jesus. In fact, Mary even questioned, "How would this be possible for me, a virgin?" (v. 34). Yet, Mary was willing to submit to surrender herself to the will of the Father.

Her heart to listen to the will of God allowed her to hear why she was favored by God and allowed her to hear a comforting promise from God—that nothing is impossible for God. Mary now knows that God's presence fulfills God's will. Doing the will of the Father involves listening to the Word of the Father so that we know that He will be with us.

A humbled heart: "I will serve"

Mary also demonstrated humbleness when she responded, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord" (v. 38a) after listening to God's will. It was enough for Mary to trust that God would be with her to fulfill His will. Mary's humbleness comes from believing that God is able to fulfill His Word. Mary was chosen by God to be the mother of Jesus—a big privilege. As a result, she humbled herself by responding that she would serve God.

When you are convinced that God is able to finish the good work that He has started in your life, your heart will be transformed from, "Are you sure Lord?" to "I will serve you."

3. A trusting heart: "I will trust"

Lastly, Mary demonstrated a trusting heart when she declared, "Let it be to me according to your word" (v. 38b). Mary did not doubt God's Word but instead was fully convinced that God was able to fulfill it. She knows that His Word is true and good. As a result, she believed that the Word of God will never fail.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Mary modeled three characteristics in doing the will of the Father: a listening heart, a humbled heart, and a trusting heart. What practices or disciplines will you do to foster this kind of heart as you do the task or ministry God has called you?
- 2. Write your own Luke 1:38: "[Insert your name] said, 'I am the Lord's servant. May you fulfill your word to me as I [insert your ministry]."

For example, Sarah said, "I am the Lord's servant. May you fulfill your Word to me as I am called to minister to the ladies in Grace Valley Women's Club."

Closing Prayer:

Father, Most High God, and Sovereign Lord—I honor You and adore You. Thank You that Your will and plan in my life is wonderful and good because it brings glory to Your name. Let this be my prayer: "I am the Lord's servant. May your word to me be fulfilled" (Luke 1:38). Strengthen me and teach me to listen to You, to humble myself to Your will, and to trust in Your sovereignty as You fulfill Your Word. In Your name, I ask and pray. Amen.
