
loves the Lord and has a passion to reach overlooked people groups in the community.

The thing that leads to contentment is the belief that I can do anything through Christ. *He* is my strength. If I do it in my own strength, I will fail. If I do it to please someone else, I will fail. If do it through Christ, I will succeed! That means I can face illness or financial hardship. I can deal with an unbelieving spouse or children. I can handle living in a small, cramped house or trailer. I can deal with a small crowd at church or a large one.

Contentment is achieved by taking my eyes off the circumstances and putting them on Christ. If I find myself complaining constantly or being negative, all that means is that I've shifted focus. My eyes are back on the perceived problem and not on the Lord. I need to stop trying to play God and allow God to do the work.

As you seek to grow in Christ, and to become more like Him, spend time daily in His word and prayer. Begin to focus on Him so that contentment takes over. Remember that you can do or face anything as long as you keep your eyes on Him and face the day with *His* strength.


