- Pray that we will be able to fly to Florida to visit Sandys family for Christmas.
- Pray For some much needed refreshment.

Dr. Renee Valach, Bongolo Hospital, West Africa

- We are thankful for the expected arrivals of the Thranes and the Ingrassias. The Thrane
 family is expected to come from Albertville just before Christmas. Britta is a nursing instructor and Kalen will Manage Projects and Maintenance. Then the Ingrassias should
 arrive after the New Year from Syracuse. Chelsea is also a nursing instructor and Phil is
 a nurse anesthetist who will help teach in our training program. Pray for their things to arrive from the other country.
- Currently, the only way to get a Covid test for a suspect patient, is as part of research study through the research institute 4 hours north of here. Pray that we would have access to Covid tests for patients who need them. We had one suspect patient this week who died.

- Praise God that the Gabonese church was finally given permission to meet again starting

Wheels Transportation Ministry By Julie Mills

I have always had a heart to help Alliance International Workers and up until a couple of years ago I was the Alliance Women's Director at my church, Jamestown C&MA Church. It was through the Alliance Women's Retreats and Delta Lake Family Camp that I got to know some of the International Workers (IWs) by name. I began to write to several IW's about 8 years ago, and actually sent out a letter asking what some of their needs were. I was determined to help them, but I just didn't know how.

As I read of Paul's journeys in the Bible, I see that the missionaries were not on their own in their travels. They had support on the field and from home churches. In Philippians 1:4-8, Paul says, "Whenever I pray, I make my requests for all of you with joy, for you have been my <u>partners</u> in spreading the good news about Christ..." (NLT) Paul also writes to the church in Colosse in Colossians 1:4ff "For we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and your love for all of God's people, which come from your confident hope of what God has reserved for you in heaven..." (NLT)

Those 2 passages from Paul tell us a lot. Churches were partners to IW's. Paul prayed for those churches with joy. Paul had co-workers. And, the Good News is bearing fruit, or changing lives because of our International Workers. When we support IW's, we are not only <u>partners</u> with them, but it allows the gospel of Christ to be shared all over the world. Our efforts to be partners, whether in prayer, giving, or support of any kind to the IW are signs of being a faithful servant and allow less worry for the IW so that they may focus more on ministry.

When I asked those questions several years ago, the one response that spoke to me the most was the IW need for a good vehicle. Traveling to see family and speaking at churches sharing about their ministry depends on good transportation. It is very hard to come home for 3 months to a year and try to purchase or even lease a car. The responses to follow-up questions about using a car while on home assignment were eye-opening. The cars they were able to use were either expensive, in bad shape, or constantly breaking down.

Some IW's have had better experiences, but most of the time the IW get the "leftovers" or "pickles". My heart longs to encourage IW's in a way that helps them to have less stress as they come home and need to find transportation for both family and ministry.

I heard of a Church in Pennsylvania that had started a ministry in 2008. The Spring Grove Alliance Church felt the call and Pastor Nate Conklin headed up a ministry called Missionary Wheels. His church only has about 25 people, but they have 6 cars in use.

I have felt led to join with Spring Grove Alliance Church and coordinate with them and eventually bring this to our district through Jamestown C&MA Church. So how can you help? The first way is pray. I will be sending out an updated letter twice a year in October and April. The second way is to give financially (see attached bulletin insert), and the third way is to donate a vehicle that is in decent and working order.

Please feel free to contact me with any questions. My contact information is on the bulletin insert. Feel free to share with your Alliance Women's groups and your local church family. I pray that God will stir your heart in some way, whether it is to pray for or help provide or our International Workers. God is good and we are partners!
