There was a devastating fire at a camp in our capital for internally displaced peoples (refugees of their own country from the north, many of these people have been chased from their homes). It burned everything. It started from burning a trash heap. 2,500 people live there. There are just 3 IWs in that city currently and they are doing a lot of relief, very busy, and working alongside the local church. Pray for those grieving family members, and for God's provision. May the church be a light to them as they are reaching out.

We would appreciate prayer for our teammates still in country, for peace amidst the changes. Covid-19 regulations are causing extreme poverty unfortunately, which is leading to more people joining jihadist groups, and more insecurity. Pray those groups would be exposed for what they are, and for Gods provision for families.

I'll be 31 weeks pregnant so pray baby will stay in me at least till 35 weeks. I'm having a lot of "practice contractions ", some extra amniotic fluid, and baby is breach so far. Nothing real worrisome but I'm trying to lay low. Thankfully P is an amazing dad to to our 2 and 4-year olds and a big help with the house. Pray for strong faith to trust God no matter what comes.

Because of the funding shortage for the C&MA we are unsure of when we will be returning to our host country. Pray for wisdom for our leadership, and also for God's provision and end to this virus.

A fire completely destroyed the shacks and belongings of over 300 displaced families in our area of ministry (West Africa)

Our oldest son is still planning to get married on July 19th. We are hoping, praying and trusting it will happen.

We don't have tests for Covid-19 here, and we are not allowed by the government to buy them. The praise is that there are no cases of Coronavirus here yet.

I was supposed to come for Home Assignment in July. The date for the borders to reopen for flights out of the country may not be for quite some time. Home Assignment could be postponed for quite some time.

Pray for us with the eventual arrival of Covid 19.

That Gabon and Bongolo would be spared the full force of the disease as in the United States and Europe. The health system here is much more fragile.

For our health and protection.

That we would shine God's light to fearful people.

Pray for the hospital finances, and decisions we may need to make if the situation continues.

Pray for Dieu Merci (doo merci). He is the teen boy who crosses the border (often on unofficial "elephant paths") from the Republic of Congo for his HIV medicines. The borders of Gabon are closed. He is already a month late for his medicine. I called his sister, who confirmed that he tried to come, but was sent back at the border. Other people were captured crossing the border and were taken directly to Libreville.

Pray for Pascal. He is a 15-year-old with HIV with severe anemia. His HIV is well controlled, but we can't find the cause of the anemia, and he has required multiple transfusions.

Prayer Requests:

Two CAMA local businesses will take a hit financially as sales dropped considerably in their respective countries due to country wide lockdowns, closed postal systems, and no international flights meaning no shipping orders and no tourists to purchase products. Please pray for us as we determine how best to help the people affected by this bump in the road — and we don't know how long everything will last.

In our Asia Region alone, we are helping some local churches reach out to their communities as many earned only day to day wages for manual labor. The lockdowns in these countries meant no work for people who already lived on the margins. PTL that CAMA has provided relief funding for food and basic supplies and we were able to do it through the local church — even in 3 Creative Access Countries. Pray that this practical testimony of love will be an attractive witness and that the churches will grow in maturity and numbers through this process. Our country officially closed its borders to all foreigners right after we returned to the USA. Even those who hold a valid visa like us cannot enter the country. I imagine it will remain closed until the rest of the world gets a handle on COVID-19 -- probably several months. For now, we can't get back to our apartment, belongings, jobs or school.

In addition, our future jobs in Kansas that were supposed to start this summer have been postponed due to the economy / virus. No one has any idea how long they will be delayed.

Based on both of these new developments, we will NOT be ending our service with the English Language sending organization on July 31 as planned. Thankfully, our organization allows us to remain employees one month for every year that we served. For us, that's 8 years, which equals 8 months. That means we can continue to remain on their health insurance and receive donations through March 2021. This will help us as we try to juggle this in-between adventure.

K is under contract to our University until mid-July, so he is teaching six LIVE classes a week. This means he gets up and teaches at 2am and 4am so he is live for his students!

Even though K is working and getting paid, all his paychecks are in a bank account back in our host country that we can't access at this time. In addition, we are still required to pay full rent for our apartment, even though we can't get back. We are trusting that He will meet our needs according to His glorious riches and guide us into our next steps.
