"Father forgive them because they do not know what they are doing."

I am amazed at Jesus' ability to see through the behaviors and actions of that shouting mob and look straight at the heart. As he hung suffering on the cross, listening to the mocking and the hate that was spewing out of the mouths of his executioners, he looked straight through to their heart and saw what was behind the words.

ers about the necessity of being set free from unforgiveness. As a believer forgiveness is not just something nice to do, but is critical for my own walk with the Lord. I desire to forgive when others hurt me. I want to keep my focus on the Lord. I want to share in His suffering so that I may grow. I want to push past my fears, anxieties, hurts, anger, frustrations and all the other negative emotions that seem to want to rise up every day of my life. I want to be free and learn to forgive, even when forgiveness is not sought out by the one inflicting the wounds.

Because that's the point of this, isn't it? Christ forgave them even though they didn't understand and even though they didn't repent. They didn't look up at his bruised and bloodied body and feel remorse. They kept right on cursing and taunting and mocking.

My prayer, and I hope it is your prayer as well, is to forgive others for the little slights and unintentional hurts as well as those major things. Because if we cannot forgive, then we make meaningless the sacrifice of the Lamb. If we can't let things go, then Christ's death is worthless. Forgiveness comes with a price. It was the price of His sacrifice. But we also experience a benefit. It is the release we feel when we can let go of the hurt inflicted, and leave it in God's hands.

Let go of the hurt. Let go of the rejection. Let go of the wounds. Let go of the words.

"Father forgive them because they do not know what they are doing."


