Encouraging Women with God's Word

I shared this message as part of the Fall Refocus videos that went out and wanted to break it into a couple of different articles and share it here because I think it's so important for women (and men) in our churches to be actively encouraging one another.

Most women I meet are going through tough times, and as believers we need to encourage one another with the truth found in God's word. Platitudes and self-help books don't offer the help people need and a pull-yourself-up-by-your-own-bootstraps message won't encourage those struggling. But God's word will always bring the exact words that someone needs to hear at just the right time.

As believers we are to encourage and build up the body. We are to remind each other of the truth found in God's Word. We will go through hard times and difficulties on this earth and we need other believers to come alongside us and encourage us. But we need to be encouraged with a message of truth and hope.

1 Thessalonians 5:11 says, *Therefore, encourage one another and build each other up as you are already doing.* Whenever you see the word, 'therefore', you have to look at what comes before. The beginning verses of chapter 5 talk about how the Day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. Those who don't know Christ do not expect it to happen and those who do know Jesus as their Lord and Savior have no idea when it will happen. Paul reminds the believers in Thessalonica that they need to stay alert and be serious about their faith.

And then he uses this word, "therefore." *Therefore*, because Jesus will return unexpectedly and at any moment, encourage each other and build each other up as you are already doing. Paul tells the Thessalonica church to "keep on keeping on!" "Keep encouraging." "Keep edifying one another."

The Greek word for encourage is parakleite which means to call to or call for, to exhort, to encourage. More specifically, many translations say "comfort yourselves together." We are to remain in fellowship so that we can continually offer comfort and encouragement to one other as we go through difficult times. We must not only watch ourselves, but we are also called to stir up, and to strengthen and encourage one another.

How are you doing at that? Are you providing encouragement to your fellow brothers and sisters? Or do you find ways to complain, criticize, and pick them apart? Do you regularly find ways to use the word to bring words of comfort and care to those in the body of Christ? Do you open the word for yourself?

If the only time you open your Bible is to listen to a sermon, or if all the scripture you get is off a Facebook meme or short devotional then it's time to critique yourself. Because God's word cannot encourage you if you never read it, and you cannot encourage anyone else if you don't know it! Dig into God's word, learn it, soak it in. Then you will truly know how to be encouraged and to be an encouragement to others.

2 Timothy 3:16 says "All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching, for rebuking, for correcting, for training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."

Let's be known as Women of the Word!












Fall Refocus Pictures from Around the District

When Keith showed surprise to the stewardess that someone he didn't know was sitting right beside him for the whole flight, she just said, "Of course. There is an empty seat and you are wearing your mask." It did little to comfort us. Getting off the plane here in our city was no different: there was no social distancing whatsoever until we reached the passport control line. Please pray that they continue to avoid getting the Covid virus.
- Saying goodbye to their family was difficult. Pray for their family as well as Keith and Krista as they navigate the coming days, weeks, months and years apart.

Edward & Sandy Zogg, Dominican Republic

- That their daughter, Rachel, can get acclimated back into her university in the new Covid-regulated environment.

Dr. Renee Valach, Bongolo Hospital, West Africa

- She is thankful that all the hospital staff and their family members who were sick with Covid are currently well. Continue to pray for their protection from Covid.
- Currently, there is no way to test for Covid in the province. When new people with probable Covid come and need to be hospitalized, the hospital doesn't whether to care for them in the Covid Unit, or in the main hospital and risk infecting others. A representative from the World Health Organization who visited recently, said that soon Covid tests will be available to use with one of their current lab machines. Please pray that tests arrive soon. (This WHO doctor was originally a doctor at an Alliance hospital in Democratic Republic of Congo.)
- The hospital is currently low or out of most medicines for blood pressure. A big shipment of medicines is due to arrive in the port on October 15th. Pray that these are allowed to enter through customs quickly, and inexpensively.
- There is an organization that provides grants to help teaching hospitals in Africa. Last year, they considered Bongolo, but decided to give the grants to other hospitals. Just now, completely unexpectedly, they've decided to reconsider. Certain things have changed since their visit last year that make Bongolo a better candidate. This grant could be really helpful to help Bongolo train Christian health care workers who can spread the good news all over Africa at the same time they deliver compassion care. The staff at Bongolo will speak with them in October. Pray for their decision.

Stewart Stemple, Hong Kong

- Stu is finishing up his current job in Hong Kong and he will be in Florida at his parents through Christmas.
- Pray that he finishes out his month well at his current company.
- Pray that God will direct his next steps as he puts out resumes to different overseas companies. He has interviews with jobs in Hong Kong, London, Dubai, and Singapore.
