Returning /traveling teammates coming soon -- we will be very happy to see them. Pray that I can have a calm manner with the kids when I get frustrated with them. Wisdom/grace with school starting in October.

CAC Worker, S

- I had quite a dramatic trip to my CAC a couple of weeks ago. I was supposed to arrive on August 28th, however, airlines kept getting canceled and I finally got stuck in Istanbul, Turkey in the middle of my destination flight and couldn't get into the country. I had to switch hotel bookings and flights and the earliest hotel I could book was September 10th, so I spent nearly two weeks in Turkey. Finally, I arrived on September 10 and began my required 21-day quarantine. I am in a hotel room and I cannot leave the room, unless I want to face a \$25,000 fine and 6 months in prison. They are very serious here.
- I get out of my quarantine at midnight on the 30th of September and I can't wait!! Fortunately, I was able to
 start work at my new job. I have Zoom calls all day long to meet and greet my new team members, my subordinates, various global function heads, and various colleagues throughout Asia. I am learning a lot about the
 business and about the culture and workings of the company. It also helps pass my days more quickly to have
 something that occupies my thoughts and time.

Dr. Renee Valach, Bongolo Hospital, Gabon, Africa

- Please pray that we would have a steady supply of medicines. Covid has caused medicine shortages, and a
 government official has blocked certain medicines. We are buying some medicines in the capital city at a much
 higher price. For the past week we were out of basic medicines like ibuprofen, oral diabetes medicines and
 some blood pressure medicines.
- Pray that the government health insurance would pay the hospital. Lack of payments over most of this year is even more difficult when we are forced to buy more expensive medicines.
- Pray for the safe arrival of the container from the US with our yearly food order, etc. This container has been held up in the port for quite a long time. It is starting to rain here, which makes the overland transportation of a large container more difficult.
- Pray for a team from EMI (Engineering Ministries International) coming at the end of September/ beginning of October. They are coming to address planning for the hospital in terms of engineering needs such as buildings and water system, etc. The water system is at its limit and has been going down frequently recently.
- The third wave of Covid is now starting in Gabon. Only about 3% of the population here has been vaccinated.
 Currently, Pasteur Clement, the National Secretary of the Gabonese Alliance Church, who is also on the Oversight Committee of the hospital, has Covid. Pray for Pasteur Clement's recovery and that God would protect us at the hospital.
- I'm thankful that a woman named Colette and her sister helping her in the hospital, both decided to ask Jesus into their lives. Colette had a rare tumor in her heart and needed an operation not possible in Gabon. She is now with Jesus.
