

St. Anthony soldier killed in Vietnam

A soldier from St. Anthony, PFC. Bernard Bax, was killed Friday, May 8, while serving with the United States Army in South Vietnam.

He was the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Bax of St. Anthony, and had observed his 19th birthday in Vietnam on March 15.

Word of his death was received Sunday night by his parents. They received two telegrams Tuesday confirming the message, and informing them that he was killed while a passenger on an Army vehicle.

PFC. Bax was with the Cavalry, and had been in Vietnam little more than two months.

He had been in Moa Loa, but in a letter dated May 4 received by his fiancée, Miss Carolyn Rehagen, he was at Ca Lou, and said he was departing on a four-day mission.

PFC. Bax, entered the Army in August, 1969, and received his basic training in Fort Knox, Ky. He left California for Vietnam on Feb. 26.

He had volunteered for Army service following his 1969 graduation from St. Elizabeth High School.

Other survivors include two brothers, Daniel and Larry, and two sisters, Debbie and Dianna. His brother, Daniel, returned a year ago on May 1 after 15 months Army duty in Vietnam.

PFC. Bax's engagement to Miss Rehagen, also a 1969 graduate of St. Elizabeth High School, was announced last week.

PFC. Bax, a lifetime resident of the St. Anthony community, was a member of St. Anthony Catholic Church.

Funeral arrangements, under the direction of Stevinsom Funeral Home of Iberia, are incomplete pending further word from the Army.
