- 7. Any wars you were engaged in while on active duty
- 8. List any combat engagements you were involved in
- 9. List details of any major injuries received while in combat.

Veterans who qualify to be recognized on this memorial are those who have lived for five years or more in the St. Elizabeth R-4 School District area. A veteran is considered to be anyone who has served in any branch of the military services during times of peace or war. The memorial is maintained by American Legion Post 545, St. Elizabeth, on church property, with permission from the Bishop of the Diocese of Jefferson City.

Bax, Bernard - Army, P.F.C. - Bernard entered the army shortly after graduating from high school in May of 1969. He was sent to Vietnam where he served as a tank gunner. The army informed the family that Bernard was killed in action on May 8, 1970 when his tank was hit by enemy fire. He is the only graduate of St. Elizabeth R-4 High School that has been killed in action. The family was informed of his death by a group of soldiers who were sent to the home from Fort Leonard Wood. The family suspected this was bad news when they saw the group of soldiers arriving at the home. To make matters even worse, the notification came on Mother's Day. His body is buried at St. Anthony Cemetery in St. Anthony.

Thirty years later a group of three Vietnam veterans came to the Bax home and told them this story. "We were in an armored personnel carrier (APC) right behind Bernie's APC in an attacking column, that they were not in Vietnam but in Laos, where a secret war was being waged against the North Vietnamese Army outside the combat zone, that their armored column was ambushed by NVA soldiers, that Bernie's APC was hit by a rocket propelled grenade as it was cresting the top of a ravine, that the U.S. soldiers in the trailing APC killed the attackers, and that the last they

saw of Bernie was when he was flown out of the battle on a medical evacuation helicopter headed for a military hospital. They did not know whether he was dead or alive, and they were now trying to find out what happened to him and to others who were wounded or killed in the battle to bring some closure to their lives."

I stepped on a mine and it blew one leg off and broke the other one. My lieutenant, 20 feet from me, also stepped on a mine and lost one leg and broke the other one. German prisoners carried both of us out. On this March 3rd Co.K had 9 killed and 19 wounded.

He looked so young and brave. We little thought that some day soon he'd be laid in a soldiers grave".

Wounded on Okinawa with bullet entering left side, went through abdomen and exited on right side. Left large hole on left side with lots of scar tissue. Another bullet entered upper right shoulder, fracturing it in the shoulder joint leaving a very bad shoulder. Awarded the Purple Heart and discharged due to permanent injuries.

From here the bomb was delivered to, and dropped on, Hiroshima, Japan. A few days later a second similar bomb was dropped on Nagasaki, Japan. The terrible destruction caused by these two new bombs finally convinced the Japanese to surrender, ending WWII. After leaving Tinian Island for the Philippines, a Japanese submarine sunk the Indianapolis shortly after midnight on July30, 1945. It took only 12 minutes for the ship to sink, and 900 of the 1200 member crew were left floating in shark infested waters. Alfred was one of the survivors in the water. After over 4 days a patrol plane spotted the survivors but only 316 were still alive. Alfred was not one of the survivors. One of the survivors later remarked that "900 of us went into the water, 316 came out, the sharks got the rest, but we delivered the bomb". Alfred was classified as missing in action on August 13, 1945. Two weeks later he was listed as killed in action.

Wilde, Shannon - Army National Guard, ISG - OIF - Served in Iraq during the Gulf War

Wilde, Victor A. - Army, Tech5 - Served on active duty for 26 months during WWII and participated in the battle for the Philippine Islands and Okinawa in the Pacific Theatre.

Wilson, Dennis - Army, Sgt. E5 - Served on active duty for 2 years with Co. B, 2nd BN 15th Infantry with service in Germany.

Worms, Conrad - Army, Cpl., Co. D, 14th Infantry - Served in WWI

Worms, George T. - Army, Pvt., Co. M, 4^{th} Infantry - Killed July 16, 1918 due to enemy action in WWI. Served in Germany and France and participated in the battles of Chateau Thierry / Bellau Wood and the Marne River. He is buried in a military cemetery in France.

Worms, Ignatz C. - Army, Pvt. - Served in Germany and France during WWI. He was exposed to mustard gas while in combat and his eyes were permanently damaged. He passed away at a veteran's home in St. James, MO and is buried at St. Lawrence Cemetery in St. Elizabeth, MO
