A note from Amy K

I have been on the board of 202 for many years now, and it is my most profound desire that 202 should last far into the future. I have made it my mission to raise enough money for an endowment fund so we will have a way to be sure of that.

202 is simply not self-supporting. Our meeting rents, concession sales, and memberships only cover about 60% of our annual expenses. We make up the rest through fundraising, an annual concert, letter writing, events like karaoke, the Big Payback etc. Even with all that, we always just break even.

I promise you that we are very frugal in our spending. We have wonderful underpaid staff, our beautiful landscaping was all donated. We make it through Covid on government grants.

An endowment fund, quite simply, is money set aside (invested) to earn revenue. The principal value of the endowment fund is kept intact, while the earnings can be used for our expenses.

We have a good start on our endowment fund. Our goal is \$1,200,000.

We currently have \$700,000 in our fund. *We also have been blessed with the promise of up to \$250,000 to match whatever we raise.* Over the next 10 months, 202 needs all the help we can get to raise that \$250,000. No donation amount is too small, and of course, none is too large! **If you can help to raise money from friends or businesses, we would love to have you on our committee.**
