



Preserve the c. 1914 Regal Theatre!

The building at 1201 Linn Street opened as the Casino Theater in 1914, and was renamed the Regal in 1941. Featuring 1,500 seats, the theater opened with a stage for vaudeville and other live acts before switching over to films. For the African American community it was a venue to see themselves on the big screen with Black movies and the only place to see Bruce Lee karate flicks. The building was designed by Zettel & Rapp Architect. Vacant since the 90s, it will now be the future home of the Robert O'Neal Multicultural Art Center (ROMAC).
