

Preserve West Price Hill's Schulte Manson!

The Schulte Manson is historically significant for its original c. 1892 Queen Anne style architecture and c. 1937 Tudor Revival style additions. These additions remind us that commercialization played a huge part in the West price Hill neighborhood's story. With all the changes Glenway Avenue has experienced, this building has withstood time.

This Queen Anne style, patterned masonry, mansion was designed by James A. Mclaughlin, c. 1892, for Henry J.Schulte, President of the GB Schulte Sons Co. During the 1930s it was purchased by the Radel family, who converted it into a funeral home and incorporated Tudor-style additions like the Porte-Cochere (A.K.A. a fancy carport). The funeral home business operated out of this location for nearly 90 years.

Today, the Schute manson is being threatened by demolition, which is why we are working with the West Price Hill to get it listed as a Local Landmark. We hope that this coloring page gains traction so we can help generate enough public support to save the Schulte!
