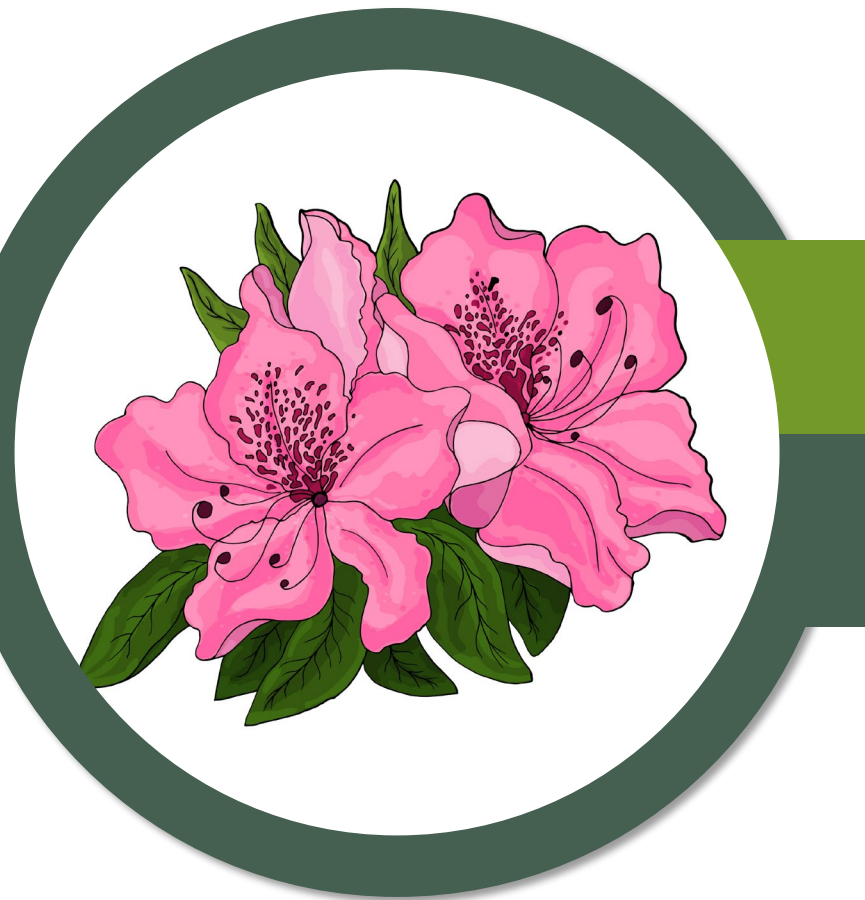


THANK YOU TO OUR MEMBERS OF OUR FOUNDERS' CLASS

Where: Lake Concord Park in Casselberry

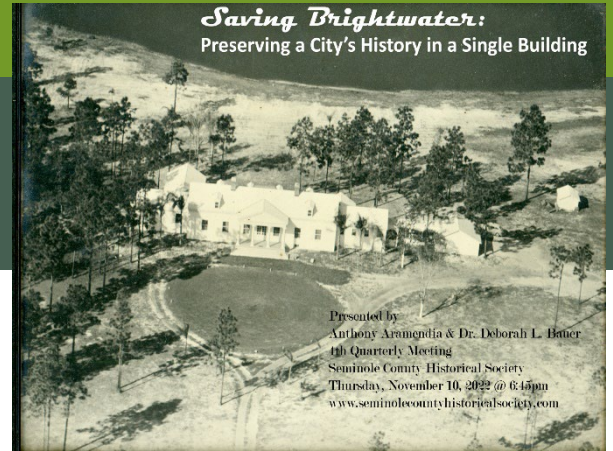

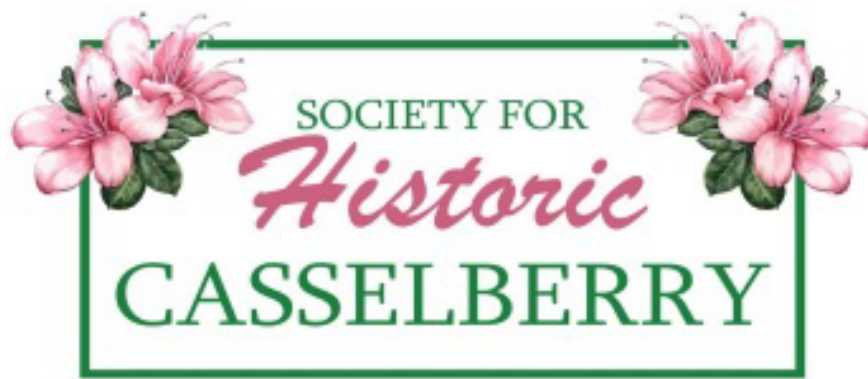

Presentation Summary: The founder and first mayor of Casselberry, Hibbard Casselberry, constructed a beautiful home on the acres of South Lake Triplet for his new wife and growing family in 1951. Famed Winter Park Historian James Gamble Rogers II designed the Neo-Classical home, and it was lived in by Casselberry family members until 2019 and the City of Casselberry purchased it in July 2021. Curious to know about how the history of an entire city was saved in a single house? Learn about the treasures Brightwater yielded in its final days and how those treasures have helped to form the foundation of the city's historical past as it is preserved going into the future!
