The Kingsbury County Board of County Commissioners met Tuesday, November 5, 2019, at 8:30 A.M. in the Commissioners meeting room in the Courthouse with Commissioners Shelley Nelson, Roger Walls, Joe Jensen, Steve Spilde, and Delmer Wolkow present. Chairman Nelson presided.

This meeting was recorded and available to listen to in the Auditor's office.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Those present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVE AGENDA

Jennifer Barnard, Auditor, informed the Board City Contract Law contracts needed to be added to the agenda.

Walls moved and Jensen seconded to approve the agenda as amended. All present voting aye, motion carried.

HIGHWAY MATTERS

Kevin Curd, Highway Union Employee Representative, met with the Board to discuss upcoming changes in payroll. Options to be discussed with union members include discontinuing the mid-month disbursement or moving to bimonthly payroll.

David Sorenson, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board to discuss highway matters.

Sorenson stated the crew was currently graveling County Road 14 and hope to have 211th repairs completed by the end of the week, weather permitting.

Sorenson will be attending a preconstruction meeting for the signing project and had just attended a meeting with FEMA on Monday, October $3^{\rm rd}$.

Sorenson and the Board discussed protocol for posting of road closure and construction signs.

Sorenson requested to declare $218^{\rm th}$ Street and $441^{\rm st}$ Avenue in emergency status per 518A-9.

AUDITOR

Barnard requested authorization to join the Welfare Association Bylaws Review Committee. Most meetings will be attended via conference call with a small possibility of travel.

Barnard informed the Board Deputy Auditor, Echo Steffensen's computer is needing to be updated and funds are available in the 2020 budget for the purchase. A quote had been received from Infotech of \$1039.99 and would be ordered in December with payment due in January 2020.

It was the consensus of the Board for the computer to be updated.

Barnard discussed the need of the I-CAP office to use the Commissioners meeting room from December 12 thru 17 for the annual Christmas giveaway.

After verifying the availability, it was the consensus of the Board to move the meeting scheduled for December 17, 2019 to the meeting space below the Sheriff's office.

Barnard discussed the scheduling of the End of Year meeting. The meeting was scheduled on Monday, December 30, 2019.

Barnard informed the Board the SDPAA renewal paperwork had been received without the updated version previously received via email and discussed.
