# SPRING LAKE TOWNSHIP

Jim Bjorkman, Wayne Soren, Scottie Hojer and Paul Johnson, with the Spring Lake Township Board, met with the Board to discuss the culvert issue in the water shed area.

Soren informed the Board the culvert by the Berg property had been replaced several years ago with the same size culvert that was there. A REA pole had been broken off in the newer culvert while attempting to clear a beaver dam. It was also stated by several board members the Spring Lake Township Board has dealt with land owners with water issues in the township for years.

Soren asked if the culverts in the maintenance area were placed correctly. It is currently estimated 19 roads are closed in Spring Lake Township and those numbers change daily.

Issues with the township roads need to go through the township board first.

The two Boards discussed the spraying of weeds along Big Ditch #4, reviewed the assessment funds available in the Big Ditch Money Market Fund and the possibility of additional clean-out of an additional three-mile section.

Jensen moved and Spilde seconded for the Auditor to reimburse the county for expenses for the Big Ditch #4 maintenance project incurred prior to the assessment being collected. All present voting aye, motion carried.

#### SHERIFF

Steven Strande, Sheriff, met with the Board to request authorization to travel to two conferences. The annual Sheriff Conference on April 22-24, 2019 and the Sex Offender Training on April 29 thru May 1, 2019.

Spilde moved and Walls seconded to approve the travel to both conferences. All present voting aye, motion carried.

The Board and the Sheriff discuss the flooded roads in the county.

# KINGSBURY COUNTY DISASTER DECLARATION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Kingsbury County, South Dakota on March 13, 2019 and continuing suffers severe storm damage caused by melting snow runoff and rain, and

WHEREAS, this quick snowmelt and rain caused county-wide flooding, and

Whereas, the flooding has affected all of Kingsbury County, and

NOW IT BE RESOLVED THAT the Kingsbury County Commissioners do hereby declare a disaster for the population the area impacted.

The Kingsbury County Commissioners respectfully request that any and all assistance that may be available from State and Federal agencies be provided to all local governments to include Kingsbury County and to the

local businesses and the general population as we work to overcome this disaster.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED THAT the Kingsbury County Commissioners do hereby declare a flooding disaster and respectfully request the Governor of the State of South Dakota to declare a disaster area and to request a Presidential Declaration of Disaster to insure that the maximum amount of assistance is made available to local government, business and residents affected.

Jensen moved and Wolkow seconded for Chairman Nelson to sign the disaster declaration resolution. All present voting aye, motion carried.

Bau discussed the need to upgrade the computer and two printers in her office. Bau is waiting on a quote from InfoTech for all equipment.

Bau informed the Board the weather school went well and there were approximately 80 attendees.

#### DIRECTOR OF EQUALIZATION

Tammy Anderson, Director of Equalization, met with the Board to discuss the local Equalization Boards on April 9, 2019.

Anderson informed the Board there is a need to upgrade the computers for herself and her deputy. Anderson is waiting on a quote from InfoTech.

Anderson informed the Board the Durango needs maintenance. The estimated cost from Palmlund Automotive is \$516.50 for brakes and rotors.
