OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS KINGSBURY COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

De Smet, South Dakota June 4, 2020

The Kingsbury County Board of County Commissioners met Thursday, June 4, 2020 at 8:30 A.M. in the County Commissioners meeting room in the Courthouse with Commissioners Steve Spilde and Shelley Nelson attending via Zoom along with State's Attorney Gregg Gass and Donna Palmlund with the Kingsbury Journal. Delmer Wolkow, Roger Walls and Joe Jensen present. Chairman Walls presided.

This meeting was recorded and is available in the Auditor's office for listening.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Those present stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVE AGENDA

Jennifer Barnard, Auditor, informed the Board the Plat of Carmon Children Acres would need to be added to the agenda along with Discretionary Formula for the Director of Equalization. Walls also added to discuss the current Ordinance and Resolution that is in place for the county.

Nelson moved and Wolkow seconded to approve the agenda as edited. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0, motion carried.

HIGHWAY

David Sorenson, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board to discuss highway matters.

Sorenson discussed the status of the Whitewood bridge. Barriers are up and drivers take risk into their hands if they go around them.

Sorenson presented a resolution to request a grant to help with the cost of fixing the road to the De Smet Cemetery. The County would be responsible for 20% of the cost.

Barnard read the following resolution:

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the County of Kingsbury to upgrade County Road 18 to better serve a local cemetery that includes the Ingalls family burial site and area businesses; and

WHEREAS, Kingsbury County agrees to provide a 20% local match for road construction costs, plus pay all engineering and administrative costs associated with said project; and

WHEREAS, Kingsbury County will secure the required right-of-way for the construction of the project; and

WHEREAS, Kingsbury County agrees to maintain the road for its useful life;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Kingsbury County Commission duly approves the submission of a SD Department of Transportation Community Access Grant application requesting 80% of the eligible street construction costs for the project as submitted;

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Commission Chairman be authorized to execute and sign the grant application on behalf of Kingsbury County.

Wolkow moved and Jensen seconded to accept the resolution as edited. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0. Motion carried.

Sorenson informed the Board the highway crew would start assisting Miner County starting the week of June 8th and would work on other road maintenance in the county of Fridays.

New signs will be going up with the new Federal Signage Project this week.

Sorenson informed the Board there are a couple trucks needing to be repaired.

The Board discussed calls that had been received from residents on the condition of the roads in Kingsbury County, as well as parked cars on the side of roads and people fishing on the sides of bridges, and farmers are not able to get machinery down the road.

Sorenson discussed property owners' requests for the county to share the cost of tiling when there is potential to help keep water off the county roads.

It was the consensus of the Board to maintain the policy of not sharing in the cost and for roads to be repaired if a private project does take water off the roadway. Kooper Caraway, AFSCME Union Rep., and Casey Harty, with the Highway Department, joined the meeting to discuss union contract negotiations. Caraway joined via Zoom.

Jensen moved and Spilde seconded to adjourn from regular session and move into Executive Session for Contract Negotiation at 9:30 A.M. All present voting aye -5, nay -0. Motion carried.

Jensen moved and Wolkow seconded to adjourn from Executive Session and return to regular session. Chairman Walls declared the Board out at 9:53 A.M.

Nelson moved and Spilde seconded to accept the Union Contract as edited contingent on the approval from Legislative Audit. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0. Motion carried.

STATE'S ATTORNEY - LAKE THOMPSON

Jim Knight, Lake Thompson resident, joined the meeting via Zoom.

Gass suggested to move into Executive Session for possible litigation and for Jim Knight to remain for the meeting.

Nelson moved and Jensen seconded to adjourn from regular session and move into Executive Session for possible litigation at 10:04 A.M. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0. Motion carried.

Wolkow moved and Jensen seconded to adjourn from Executive Session and return to regular session. Chairman Walls declared the Board out at 10:21 A.M.

Gass requested a motion to submit a clean-out plan to DENR, and to approve the bill from Brosz for the locating of the hard bottom of the outlet for \$4,750.00.

Jensen moved and Nelson seconded to approve the letter to DENR and to pay the bill to Brosz. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0. Motion carried.

Knight informed the Board of the status of the Road District, Lake Project District and the possible future special assessment for road issues.

OPEN DISCUSSION - STATUS OF THE COURTHOUSE

Tammy Anderson, Director of Equalization, Elaine Blachford, Treasurer, Lonny Palmlund, Maintenance, Jennifer Malone, Clerk of Courts, joined the meeting. Caryn Hojer, Register of Deeds joined the meeting via conference call.

The Board discussed the status of the Courthouse and the surrounding area regarding Covid-19. While the Courthouse will remain locked with limited access to the public, Lonny Palmlund, Maintenance, will be making adjustments to the windows in the Treasurer's office to allow more customers to be helped at one time.

MAINTENANCE

Palmlund informed the Board a letter had been received from House of Glass requesting a 60-day extension of the project completion date. Materials have been delayed due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Jensen moved and Wolkow seconded to move the window replacement project deadline out 60 days to September 1, 2020. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0, motion carried.

Palmlund informed the Board a call had been placed to Carr Tuckpointing, and they are experiencing the same delays and may need to move our job into 2021 depending on the window completion timeframe.

ELECTION CANVAS

Barnard presented the Board with the Primary Election Poll Books and tabulator print out for verification. Jensen reviewed Lake Preston and De Smet Precincts; Walls reviewed Oldham and Badger Precincts; Wolkow reviewed Arlington and Iroquois Precincts, and Walls, Jensen and Wolkow reviewed the Absentee Precinct together. Spilde and Nelson observed via Zoom.

All numbers were found to be accurate for each precinct.

Spilde moved and Jensen seconded to certify the true abstract of the votes cast in Kingsbury County, and to sign the Certificate for the State of South Dakota. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0, motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Chairman Walls asked for public comment. There was none.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Chairman Walls asked the Board if there was any conflict of interest. There was none.

PLANNING AND ZONING

Wolkow moved and Spilde seconded to adjourn from regular session and move into Planning and Zoning to review the Plats of Block 1, Reinicke Addition

and Carmon Children Acres at 12:01 P.M. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0. Motion carried.

Chairman Walls declared the Board out at 12:08 P.M.

Spilde moved and Wolkow seconded to accept the Plats of Block 1, Reinicke Addition as recommended by the Planning and Zoning Board. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0, motion carried.

Wolkow moved and Spilde seconded to accept the Plat of Carmon Children Acres as recommended by the Planning and Zoning Board. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0, motion carried.

DIRECTOR OF EQUALIZATION

Anderson requested the Board approve the purchase of carpet for her office and the hallway on the third floor.

Anderson received a quoted in December of 2019 for \$970.00 for the office and \$1,380.00 for the hallway. The funds are available in her 2020 budget.

Jensen moved and Wolkow seconded to approve the carpet project for the third floor. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0, motion carried.

Anderson presented the following resolution to the Board for the Discretionary Formula that the county currently uses and will now only be continued for counties that adopt the resolution.

Barnard read the following resolution:

Kingsbury County Resolution No: 2020-09

Discretionary Formula SDCL 10-6-35.2

Whereas, the County of Kingsbury, State of South Dakota has deemed it in the best interest of the County to adopt a Resolution implementing a Discretionary Formula for reduced taxation of new structures and additions and partially constructed structures pursuant to $SDCL\ 10-6-35.2$

NOW, be it resolved, that for purposes of the property taxation in the County of Kingsbury, State of South Dakota, any structures classified pursuant to SDCL 10-6-35.2 shall, following construction be valued for taxation purposes as follows, to-wit:

- a. For the first year following construction, not more than 20% of the usual assessed value shall be used for tax purposes on such property.
- b. For the second tax year following construction, not more than 40% of the usual assessed value shall be used for tax purposes on such property.
- c. For the third year following construction, not more than 60% of the usual assessed value shall be used for the tax purposes on such property.
- d. For the fourth year following construction, not more than 80% of the usual assessed value shall be used for the tax purposes on such property.
- e. For the fifth year following construction, not more than 100% of the usual assessed value shall be used for the tax purposes on such property.

For the purposes of this resolution this shall include any new industrial, or an addition to an existing structure which new structure or addition has a full and true value of \$30,000 or more. This shall also include all new non-residential agricultural structures, or the addition structure or additions shall have a full & true value of \$30,000 or more, added to real property that are specifically classified for the purpose of taxation.

The owner of any of the above described property may request the Board of County Commissioners to avoid application of this formula and the full assessment shall be made without the application of the formula. In waiving this formula for the structures of one owner, the Board of County Commissioners is not prohibited for subsequent new structures by that owner.

Any structure that is partially constructed on the assessment date may be valued for tax purposes pursuant to this resolution and the valuation may not be less than the assessed valuation of the property in the year proceeding the beginning of construction.

During any period of time that the property is valued for tax purposes pursuant to the Resolution, the period of time may include the years when

the property is partially constructed. Thereafter, the property shall be assessed at the same percentage as all other property for tax purposes.

Nelson moved and Jensen seconded to approve Resolution 2020-9 Discretionary Formula SDCL 10-6-35.2. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0, motion carried.

Anderson requested the Board approve an abatement for Record # 4765. This would remove the value of two houses and add the value of another.

Jensen moved and Nelson seconded to approve the abatement for Record # 4765. All present voting aye - 5, nay - 0, motion carried.

AUDIOR

Barnard discussed the opportunity for a County employee to participate in a 12 week on-line Professional Development Academy. The program is being offered for a full scholarship of \$1,995.00 for one person from the county.

It was the consensus of the Board for Barnard to inquire into any employees' interest in the program.

Nelson needed to leave the meeting.
