## PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Those present stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### APPROVE AGENDA

Echo Steffensen, Auditor, informed the Board of Rita Anderson's request to be added to the agenda to discuss the status of the Hwy 14 Trails Project.

Motion by Spilde and seconded by Lee to approve the agenda with the addition of Rita Anderson at 12:00 P.M. All present voting aye. Motion carried.

#### MINUTES

Motion by Walls and seconded by Lundquist to approve the minutes of May 17, 2022, with one spelling correction. All present voting aye. Motion carried.

Motion by Lundquist and seconded by Lee to approve the minutes of May 27, 2022. All present voting aye. Motion carried.

# PUBLIC COMMENT

Chairman Kazmerzak asked for public comment.

Shawn Geyer addressed the Board concerning the Medical Cannabis Zoning Ordinance inquiring if any consideration would be given to a possible amendment to the ordinance concerning location requirements.

### **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

Cindy Bau, Emergency Management, provided information to the Board on a Security Grant that was available. The grant consists of 2 tiers with a 75/25 match. A committee was formed with the members being Cindy Bau, Emergency Management, Jennifer Malone, Clerk of Courts, Steve Strande, Sheriff, Gary Schumacher, States Attorney and Kyle Lee, Commissioner. Schumacher has been appointed to be the lead by Judge Stoltenberg. It was the consensus of the Board that a security assessment should be obtained to prioritize the Courthouse needs. Further discussion to be held at the next meeting, June 21, 2022.

## 4-H (con't)

The Board discussed options on providing additional compensation to DeDeyne, 4H Program Assistant. It was determined that there is \$4800.00 in the budget for a part time assistant. That position has not been utilized for the past 2 years, and could possibly be used to offer as pay for additional contracted duties.
