The Kingsbury County Board of County Commissioners met Tuesday, November 18, 2025, at 8:30 A.M. in the Courtroom of the County Courthouse with Commissioners Kyle Lee, Troy Nelson, Steve Spilde, Corey Lundquist and Roger Walls present. Chairman Lee presided.

Attending via Zoom were Amy Halverson- Kingsbury Journal, Tammy Anderson - Director of Equalization and Michelle Longville - Treasurer

Chairman Lee called the meeting to order.

Sorenson presented two applications from LeSueur Township for Rural Access Infrastructure Grant funds. Total project costs are estimated to be \$70,237.20, making the estimated grant funds applied for approximately \$56.189.76. Sorenson recommended approval of the application.

TREASURER

Michelle Longville, Treasurer, met with the Board to update them on office matters.

Longville provide information to the Board on issues with mail delivery for tax payments.

Longville provided a report on the County investments, stating that the County currently holds \$1,657,523.80 in CDs with \$722,523.80 at Citizens State Bank and \$935,000.00 at First National Bank Oldham. The County has a checking account and MMDA with American Bank & Trust along with a sweep balance with Intra-fi. The Revolving Loan Fund account is with Citizens State Bank.

Longville explained how she monitors the sweep rates which are tied to the Fed target rate to determine if funds should be moved from the CDs currently held. At this time, she stated the CD rates were better so leaving them where they are. When CDs mature, she investigates where she can get the best rate before renewing or moving them.

Chairman Lee thanked Longville for her diligence in ensuring the County received the best rate possible.

AUDITOR

Echo Steffensen, Auditor, presented the 2026 Uniform Alcoholic Beverage License renewal for Mathew Store for approval and the Chairman to sign.

Motion by Nelson, second by Spilde to approve said application and for Chairman Lee to sign. All present voting aye. Motion carried.

Steffensen presented the 2026 Lake County Inmate housing contract for approval and for the Chairman to sign.

Motion by Lundquist, second by Spilde to approve the 2026 Lake County Inmate housing contract and for the Chairman to sign the same. All present voting aye. Motion carried.

Steffensen presented an estimate from G & R Controls to replace the compressor in the jury room for \$4,580.00. The Board discussed the option of installing a new unit.

Motion by Walls, second by Spilde for Chairman Lee to discuss with Mills Property and approve up to \$5,000.00 to either replace compressor or install a completely new unit. All present voting aye. Motion carried.
