Chairman Lee called the meeting to order.

HIGHWAY

Dave Sorenson, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board to discuss highway matters.

Sorenson provided the Board with a draft of a haul road agreement with Whitewood Dairy for their review. No action was taken.

HIGHWAY 5-YEAR PLAN

The Public Hearing for the Kingsbury County 5-Year Highway Plan was held.

Doug Kazmerzak and Josh Schmidt joined the meeting.

A discussion was held on the contents of the plan.

Kazmerzak brought up concerns on how the Highway Superintendent determines what areas of the County need work and asked the Board to consider identifying special projects and put money aside for those projects.

Sorenson explained the road system is divided into quarters and on a 5-year rotation for repairs, etc. unless something special is determined.

The 5-Year plan will be adopted and accepted on October 7, 2025.

The public hearing was closed.

BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

Chairman Lee declared the Board out of Board of Adjustment and back into regular session at 9:59 A.M.

RISTY BENEFITS

Sonja Nordbye and Roger Risty met with the Board to discuss employee benefit options. They presented information on an HSA plan, a Flex 125 plan and a medical transportation plan. The Board requested further information and a comparison of the County's current health plan. No action was taken on health plans. It was the consensus of the Board to move forward with offering the medical transport coverage in 2026.

MILLS PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

Chad Ebsen, Mills Property Maintenance Foreman, met with the Board to discuss maintenance matters.

Ebsen presented an estimate from Kingsbury Electric for \$2,015.00 on the electrical work on a new HVAC system at the County 4-H building and a bid from Bau Plumbing & Heating, LLC. For \$13,747.00 to install the HVAC system.

The Board discussed the previous bids from Kramer Electric for \$30,000.00, CR Mechanical for \$24,000.00 and the new bid from Bau Plumbing.

Motion by Lundquist and seconded by Nelson to accept the bids from Bau Plumbing at \$13,747.00 and Kingsbury Electric at \$2,015 to be funded with the 4-H Buildings 2025 budget and for the General Fund to match 50/50 of any amount more than the budget and the 4-H using donation funds set aside for their half. All present voting aye. Motion carried.

Ebsen presented a bid from Fonder Excavating and Dirtwork, LLC for \$25,812.83 to regrade around the highway shop.

Lundquist voiced concerns about the likelihood of the drain tile freezing and wanted clarification on how it would be installed.

Ebsen will investigate.

Motion by Nelson and seconded by Spilde to accept the bid from Fonder Excavating for \$25,812.83 with clarification of the drain tile installation. All present voting aye. Motion carried.

Ebsen presented an estimate from Whitten's Paint and Repair Handyman Service for \$3,971.00 to repair the ceiling in the balcony of the courtroom.

Motion by Lundquist and seconded by Spilde to accept the bid from Whitten's Paint and Repair Handyman Service for \$3,971.00 to repair the ceiling in the balcony of the courtroom. All present voting aye. Motion carried.

EAST RIVER ELECTRIC

Jerae Wire, Construction & Permitting Coordinator East River Electric, met with the Board to present the Petition for Franchise renewal for East River Electric to continue operating in Kingsbury County.

Commissioner Walls asked if the current project was included and voiced concerns about said project and road conditions.

Wire explained the petition was only to allow East River to continue operating n Kingsbury County and did not contain the new project.

The Board deferred action to later in the meeting.

RESOLUTION NO. 2025-16 AUTHORIZATION TO CONSTRUCT ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION LINES ON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS OF KINGSBURY COUNTY

WHEREAS, East River Electric Power Cooperative, Inc., of Madison, South Dakota, on the <u>8TH</u> day of August 2025 filed with the County Auditor of Kingsbury County, South Dakota, its duly verified Petition for the purpose of obtaining and acquiring one franchise for both its existing transmission lines and system and the planned extension and future expansion thereof, from Kingsbury County, South Dakota, by and through its County Commissioners, for the right to maintain its existing and future system and to erect and maintain poles and wires for the purpose of transmitting and distributing electricity for lighting, heating and power purposes, in, along, and over the public highways of Kingsbury County, South Dakota, for rural electrification throughout said County and State for a period of twenty years;

WHEREAS, said application was heard and considered by the members of the Board of County Commissioners of said County of Kingsbury, in South Dakota, on the $16^{\rm th}$ Day September 2025, at the hour of 11:30 o'clock a.m., in the Commissioners' Room, in the Courthouse, in the City of DeSmet, Kingsbury County, South Dakota, due notice of said hearing having been given by mail as provided by law to all persons,

firms or corporations owning or operating transmission, telegraph or telephone lines on or along any part of the highways of said County;

WHEREAS, no person, firm or corporation having appeared in opposition to the granting of such application, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board of County Commissioners of said County that the request contained in said Petition should be granted;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Kingsbury County Board of Commissioners that the right to construct, maintain and operate poles and wires, both for its existing transmission lines and system, and also for its future extension and expansion, for the purpose of transmitting and distributing electricity for lighting, heating and power purposes, over, upon, along and across the public highways within Kingsbury County, South Dakota, for rural electrification, on a countywide basis, for a period of twenty (20) years from and after the date and passage hereof, be, and it hereby is, granted to said East River Electric Power Cooperative, Inc., of Madison, South Dakota, subject to the terms and conditions of Chapter 31-26 of the South Dakota Codified Laws (1984 Revisions).

Dated 16th day of September 2025.

Motion by Lundquist and seconded by Spilde to accept and adopt Resolution 2025-16 and for Chairman Lee to sign the same.
