# Richard Chomping at the Bit!

We start this month's newsletter with exciting news from one of OPP's reader/actors, Richard 'Chomps' Thompson. Richard recently received a dollar baby license from Stephen King to adapt, write, and film *The Man Who Would Not Shake Hands*. Richard has adapted the story's core elements into a short-film adaptation as a 'Southwest Folk Tale',

and employed a widespread cast of talented members from the local community - including another OPP actor, Courteny Pulitzer.




The film is a slow burn tale of PTSD and war in a post-civil-war southwestern town that regales a heartbreaking story of solitude and trauma, while maintaining the supernatural and chilling atmosphere normally associated with Stephen King. There is a special screening of the film as a part of the Southern

Arizona Chapter (GSAAC) of the Buffalo Soldiers National Convention159th Anniversary Reunion. The Loft Cinema will host the event on Weds July 23rd at 3pm. Thompson adds: "The film's run includes the upcoming Tombstone Film Festival, plus a number of larger, more challenging festivals including the Cannes Short Film Festival. Richard is a Hearst poet at heart and has locally produced stage performances of original manuscripts including Last Call and The GRANDest Pageant at the Tucson Fringe (2026 submissions are now open btw) which became a Sundance documentary film fund consideration. He's directed both stage and film including Winding Road's 8-by-10's, God Learns of the Death of Harambe and his stage performances include Mark in the TAZ production of People, Places, and Things, and Boy Willie in Pima Community College's The Piano Lesson. Richard seeks to tell stories that use surreal, supernatural, or subtle elements as a mask over social realities that subtly disrupt audience perspective while telling a great tale in the vein of Jorden Peele or Alfred Hitchcock. He can next be seen at OPP with Robin Carson reading Adrian Cory's The Knight of Malta on August 18.


