CHRISTOPHER'S STORY

Christopher was born in Kings College Hospital south London on the 4th June 1982.

The first thing we noticed was his piercing beautiful blue eyes.

Chris was the third of our four children.

He had a very placid nature and was a very good baby. A year later his brother Phil was born and you couldn't separate them.

Chris was definitely the leader of the two, they went to the same schools throughout their growing years.

Chris would make friends very easily; he was like a magnet to people, and everyone loved to be in his company.

At 16, he was the best man at his brother Louis' wedding in Scotland; he thought he was the bees' knees for the day.

At the reception after the wedding, Chris was welcoming everyone into the bar and offered them a drink – it was a free bar.

As the evening went on, Chris was still getting drinks for everyone. Ray noticed this and thought he would play a joke on him.

He went to the bar staff and asked if they could make out a bar bill for four hundred pounds; he did inform them he was playing a joke on Chris and they were only too happy to join in the fun.

Ray went over to Chris while he was getting some more drinks and asked him what he was doing? To which he answered "my job as the best man – making sure everyone had a drink."

I said "who is paying for the drinks?" He replied "it's a free bar." I said "no, it was for the first drink only" and gave him the bar bill. Then, to make matters worse, the bar manager who was part of the prank came over demanding payment. His face just hit the floor in shock; he turned to the manager and asked if he would take a cheque. Ray looked at him and said "you don't have any money in the bank and I spent all my money getting here."

Then Louis' father in law, who was also in on it, came over and said "you are showing my family up, what are you going to do about this."

We all could see Chris was on the verge of a heart attack. We all started laughing. Then the penny dropped and he didn't know whether to laugh or cry but took it like a sport. The good thing was two girls behind the bar said they would dance with him for being a great sport.





Christopher's 18th Birthday



Chris was a fun-loving young man and you could bet something would always happen around him.

Like the day we all went to Greenwich Park with our daughter and our granddaughter Rena who was around two at the time.

Ray and Chris decided to go on the boating lake, Vi shouted "can you turn around as Rena can't see you."

So without thinking ,Chris said "let's change seats and face the other way" and then he got up out of his seat in the rowing boat, and it capsized. Ray and Chris were standing in the lake up to their waist in dirty pond water.


You had to be there it was so funny; they waded out of the water and laid on the grass in the sun to dry off. Everyone was laughing – that's how funny it was.

We got the bus home and you could still smell the stink from the pond on their clothes.

You could see people on the bus pulling faces because of the smell.

A few years later, Chris was working in a pizza shop with his sister and brother-in-law in South Croydon and opposite the shop was a tattoo shop; he asked his sister if she would go with him

Well the tattoo artist just put the needle into his arm and he just went limp and felt faint his sister had to take him out for air and walked him up and down the high street till he felt better. He recovered and was able to get the tattoo on his arm.









Chris drove a pizza delivery bike and broke the record for delivering the most pizzas in his fourteen hour shift. He won a cheap watch.


Another time, Chris entered a radio show phone in contest and won a long weekend in Paris and two hundred pounds spending money. He rang Ray and Vi and said "I want you two to have the holiday because you both deserve a break." That is the kind-hearted person he was (But he did keep the money)

YOUR HOST FOR TONIGHT MARTY DEE DONOVAN



Your Host for tonight is the great Marty Dee Donovan

Marty grew up in Stockwell after moving from the Vauxhall end of Lambeth in 1975, leaving school a tad early when he hit 16 he started a bakery apprenticeship which he passed after 4 years, running his one-man bakery for 'Broomfield's up at the top of Acre Lane Brixton South london.

As much as he loved baking, he was drawn into the entertainment world starting off by helping his Dad with his mobile Disco and later going on to run his own disco throughout the '80s and early '90s. 1993 saw Marty transition over to the nightclub world, compering, also standup comedy. Running alongside Marty's work-life was his first love, "Radio".

After being 'Busted' (caught) on his father's pirate radio station 'Radio Gemini' Marty was taken to Horseferry Magistrates Court and given community service by an understanding judge as he sent him to work at St Thomas' Hospitals 'Radio Beckett'.

After networking through radio Marty got himself invited along to Pat Sharps radio show at Capital radio and from there the world was his oyster, Invicta Radio beckoned after that then into commercial radio and some program 'time' reading for BBC on the other side. From there was the natural progression to Voice overs, and Voice acting too.

These days Marty has a daytime radio show that tries to brighten people's days by playing feel-good music and giving the listeners a chance to take part in the show and choose the music direction. Marty aims to bring together a radio community in real-time that spreads joy and brings people together – The Station is Medway Sound (www.MedwaySound. Uk) and Marty can be heard weekdays from 3 to 7 pm through the afternoon.

He also is a compere for Hire and Mobile Disco DJ – Who wouldn't want to Party with Marty.

WHAT IS **RESTORATIVE JUSTICE?**

Restorative Justice (RJ) is a different way of tackling crime, based not on punishment but on healing the harm that's been caused.

It brings offenders into face -toface conversations with their victims- and sometimes that dialogue is so powerful it can transform the future of each participant.

Victims can get answers to questions about the crime they've suffered, which for many brings new peace of mind, and the person who committed the crime gets the opportunity to try to make amends to the people they've hurt. This has been shown to slow down future offending. Sometimes RJ is used as an alternative to criminal prosecution(very low level crime) but mostly it's used alongside the Criminal Justice System.

But an important principle is that the participants should come to an RJ meeting voluntarily; noone should be forced to take part if they don't want to. And we at the Chris Donovan Trust believe very strongly that the facilitators should be properly trained and accredited, so that the encounter only goes ahead after thorough preparation of all parties, and as assurance of the safety and total confidentiality.

I have lived with hurt and anger and bitterness for so long I could never figure out why it would never leave me.

Also I could never figure out why I could never forgive myself for all my wrongs. The answer was right there in my face the whole time. The anger and bitterness I had inside of my head control of me. And in order for me to move on I need to forgive my Father before I can forgive myself.

I am still angry but at least I know what it is I got to do, Go and visit my Father grave and talk to him tell him I forgive him and let him go from my life.

I am now where I am in my life because of two wonderful people such as yourself. I have never listen so humbled in my life as I was a few weeks ago on that day I first met you.

The work you do is truly amazing you really have been and remain to be an inspiration to me.


So for now I wish you both well as I hope to be myself one day Thank you both so so much.

GERARD DRENNAN



Dr. Gerard Drennan Ph.D. first heard about what happened to Christopher, and the journey Ray & Vi have been on ever since, when they accepted an invitation to speak at a Symposium Gerard organised in Sussex, to begin to introduce restorative justice practices into mental health settings, in 2014. Through their work for the Chris Donovan Trust, Ray & Vi have supported Gerard's efforts to bring restorative justice practice to mental health settings in a myriad of ways since this time. Gerard invited Ray & Vi to speak on the first ever Victim Awareness and Restorative Justice courses ever delivered in a secure mental health setting at the Bethlem Royal Hospital and the success of this meant it was followed by more courses. Ray & Vi brought the Crowded House production, The Listening Room, to the Royal Bethlem and Maudslev Hospitals in 2017 and 2018 to promote mental health

engagement with restorative justice. Gerard was honoured to write the foreword to Restored and Forgiven (Bridge Logos Publications), the book that has brought the Donovan family story to so many people. In recognition of his work, the Chris Donovan Trust made a Pioneering Restorative Justice in Mental Health Award to Gerard in 2018.

Gerard is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist in the NHS and Psychoanalytic Psychotherapist, and he holds the post of Lead Consultant in Forensic and Offender Health, and Head of Psychology & Psychotherapy in the Behavioural & Developmental Psychiatric Operations Directorate of the South London & Maudsley Mental Health Foundation Trust. Gerard became the Chair of the Board of Trustees of the Restorative Justice Council in June 2021.

PORTSMOUTH

AN AWARD FOR JOHN KEBLE SCHOOL

On 29th June, Mrs Allard, Ms Hawker, Ms Harvey and Ms Rau went to an event hosted by The Chris Donovan Trust. During the event, Mrs Allard won an award for her Dedication to the Cause of Restorative Justice. This award recognises the skilled restorative work that all the staff at John Keble School take part in. We are very proud of this work.



Ray and Vi have a very powerful story to tell. Their son, Chris, was murdered by 3 teenage gang members.

Ray and Vi spoke to Years 4, 5 and 6 separately and they held a workshop for parents. They spoke about what it felt like to lose their son. They talked about their Restorative Journey and how they had met their son's killers to find out why the boys had killed Chris. They explained how they found out that the boys were trying to gain the respect of their friends though violence.

Their story demonstrated clearly to us the impact of our actions on others. It also showed us how dangerous bad friendships can be and showed us that they are often these bad friendships are not true friendships.

Ray and Vi spoke about forgiveness and how we need to forgive, even when we do not forget.

On behalf of The Chris Donovan Trust, they presented Portsmouth with a Restorative City Award. This is the first time the trust has recognised a city. The Lord Mayor received the award on behalf of Portsmouth and thousands of its citizens who have caught hold of the vision to see Portsmouth become established as a Restorative City.

Ray and Vi pursued Restorative justice after a shocking attack by a gang of youths who attacked and killed their son Christopher. Their heart breaking story for the truth has inspired a countless number of people to seek restorative justice and practice, breaking the cycle of hate and revenge. Speaking at the Guildhall they talked about being

'blown away' at the breadth and depth of the restorative culture that was developing within the various spheres of the city. Neither of them are strangers to Portsmouth; they worked closely with John Swindell of PMS helping to develop restorative justice in Kingston prison before it was closed.

Portsmouth Mediation Service has for a number of years been at the forefront of the city-wide restorative vision and is collaborating with a host of partners to help forge and strengthen positive relationships. Partners include Portsmouth City Council and Housing, faith groups, Schools and Colleges and the University. Every week hundreds of new people across the city are being trained and equipped with a restorative tool kit that can help prevent conflict and disputes from breaking out and escalating.


While we were in Kenya we took some food to the children at a local Orphanage.




