Adam Wheeler joined UCAP in April of 2017 as the IT Manager, with a background in network engineering and management information systems. Adam designed as well as maintains the agency website in addition to setting up and supporting every agency computer. As IT manager, Adam receives the first call when the internet goes down, phones stop working or a computer just "dies."



Under Adam's leadership, new technology like VOIP and Virtual Private Network enhance agency systems, improve access, flexibility, support file safety and save money. Currently, Adam is exploring and investigating a shift to virtual servers. According to Adam, maintaining the servers occurs in the wee hours of the morning so staff can work during the day without interruptions—proof of his dedication.

But Adam isn't all tech cables and servers. During the school year, he drives a school bus, keeping his CDL active. Before coming to UCAP, he drove the Big Orange Bus (Tulsa Shuttle), paratransit, and fixed routes for The Bus, the public transit system in Stillwater.

Instead of just playing games, he took it apart, rebuilt it, and soon had wires running across the living room as he experimented with networking. That curiosity never went away. During his high school senior year, Adam competed in Microsoft Network Administration through Meridian Technology Center—winning state and finishing top 10 nationally. By 2010 he had an associate's degree in Network Engineering from Northern Oklahoma College, followed by a bachelor's in Management Information Systems from OSU in 2014.

Adam has a lifelong love of tractors sparked by his grandfather. Currently, Adam is a member of the Oklahoma Steam & Gas Engine Association and volunteers at the Steam Engine Show in Pawnee each year. With a sizeable collection, Adam travels across Oklahoma and surrounding states showing smaller tractors and swapping knowledge with fellow collectors at every opportunity. Another community investment includes Adam's service on the Board of Pawnee Bill's Friends Association, helping keep the Wild West Show alive.

What Adam enjoys most is helping UCAP's front-line workers—the people who deal with the community every day. He knows his behind-the-scenes work makes their jobs easier. The toughest part? Staying ahead of cyber threats in a world where technology never stops changing. Still, Adam thrives on learning, researching, and connecting with IT peers across the country.

Having an in-house IT expert like Adam not only saves UCAP money but ensures that every decision is made with the agency's best interests in mind. He may not be in the spotlight, but Adam is the reason UCAP's technology runs smoothly day in and day out.
