The rider app can be downloaded from the Play Store by searching 'PICK TRANSPORTATION'.


Hours of Operation:



Pre—Trip Inspection

FTA expects federally-funded vehicles to be maintained in good operating condition and keep American's with Disabilities Act accessibility features on all vehicles in good working order. The daily Pre-trip is key to remain in compliance with regulations and insures a safe and reliable fleet.

STOP, LOOK, STAY ALIVE

Whether a CPTS vehicle is occupied or not occupied by passengers, Oklahoma Statutes, Title 47, Section 11-702, states the driver shall not cross a railroad track or tracks unless the driver stops the bus within fifty (50) feet of, and not closer than 15 feet to the tracks. Listen and look in each direction along the tracks for an approaching train. When safe to do so, the driver may drive the vehicle across the tracks. When approaching a crossing, begin to slow down and activate the four way flashers at approximately 150 feet.
