SPRING WEATHER SAFETY IN OUR COMMUNITY

As we welcome warmer days and afternoon showers, it's important to stay alert and prepared. Florida's spring weather can shift quickly—keep an eye on the sky, drive cautiously in wet conditions, and stay hydrated during outdoor activities. Wildlife becomes more active too, so give alligators and nesting birds plenty of space. A little awareness goes a long way in keeping our community safe and enjoyable.



SPRING ADVENTURES CLOSE TO HOME

Late March/early April is the perfect time to explore Central Florida's natural beauty and local charm. Take a scenic boat tour through the Winter Park Chain of Lakes, stroll the blooming gardens at Leu Gardens in Orlando, or visit the manatees at Blue Spring State Park before they migrate north. For family fun, check out seasonal festivals, farmers markets, or a day trip to Bok Tower Gardens or Lake Louisa State Park. Spring's mild weather makes every outing a little more magical!



SPRING ADVENTURES CLOSE TO HOME

FLORIDA BIRD NESTING

During Florida's nesting season, birds like Sandhill Cranes, Bald Eagles, and Hawks become highly protective of their young. Residents may notice these birds acting aggressively or defensively if people or pets get too close to their nests, as they instinctively guard their chicks and territory from perceived threats.



EASY AND FUN SPRING TREATS



Frozen Banana Bites

Ingredients

- Bananas
- Yogurt or melted chocolate
- Optional toppings: sprinkles, nuts, coconut

Steps

1. Slice bananas into bite-size rounds.
2. Dip each slice in yogurt or chocolate.
3. Add toppings if you want extra crunch.
4. Place on a tray lined with parchment.
5. Freeze for 2–3 hours until firm.

EASY AND FUN SPRING TREATS



Tasty Yogurt Fruit Bark Ingredients

- Vanilla yogurt (or any flavor kids like)
- Strawberries, blueberries, or mixed spring fruit
 - Mini chocolate chips or sprinkles
 - Granola (optional for crunch)

Steps

1. Line a baking sheet with parchment
2. Spread yogurt into a thin, even layer.
3. Sprinkle chopped fruit, chocolate chips, and granola on top.
4. Freeze for 2–3 hours until completely firm.
5. Break into pieces and enjoy your “bark.”

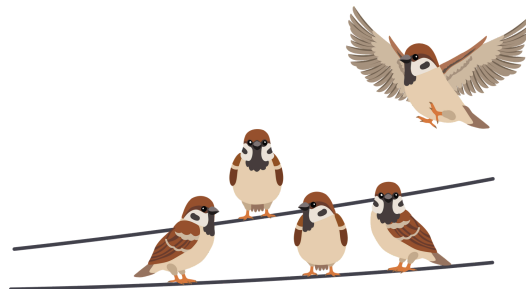
EARLY SPRING FUN FACTS - FLORIDIA STYLE

Central Florida warms up fast—by late March/early April, daytime temps often feel like early summer while the rest of the country is still thawing out.

Manatees begin leaving warm-water refuges as natural waters warm.

Florida's "Flower Season" begins. Spring is when native plants like coreopsis, blanketflower, salvia, and milkweed burst into color, inviting Pollinators like butterflies, etc.

Natural Springs Are Crystal Clear
Central Florida's freshwater springs stay around 72°F year-round, making spring perfect for kayaking, manatee spotting, and swimming.



SPRING BOAT SAFETY TIPS - FLORIDIA STYLE

Central Florida's lakes are beautiful but can change quickly, so stay alert on the water.

Always wear a properly fitted life jacket, keep an eye on shifting weather—spring storms can build fast—and follow all posted speed zones, especially near shorelines and wildlife areas.

Stay aware of other boaters, paddlers, and anglers, and avoid creating large wakes in narrow canals.

Because alligators and other wildlife are common, keep hands and feet inside the boat and maintain a safe distance from the shoreline.

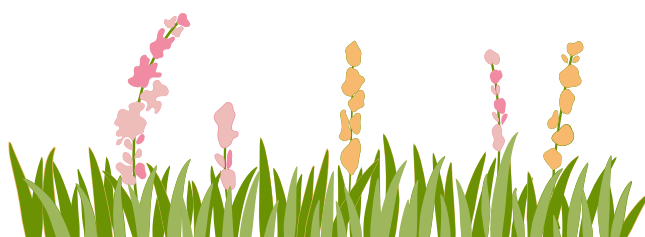
A little caution helps everyone enjoy our lakes safely.

Respect Quiet Hours

Avoid early mornings & late evenings.



Check the Wind Direction

Pressure washing in Florida comes with a few unwritten rules that help keep neighbors, pedestrians, and the environment in mind. It's important to stay aware of overspray, and sidewalk safety matters too. And because Florida's storm drains often lead directly to natural waterways, being mindful of water runoff and avoiding harsh chemicals protects both local ecosystems and community standards.
