"The New Colossus" by Emma Lazarus (1849-1887)

Not like the brazen giant of Greek fame,
 With conquering limbs astride from land to land;
 Here at our sea-washed, sunset gates shall stand
 A mighty woman with a torch, whose flame
 Is the imprisoned lightning, and her name
 Mother of Exiles. From her beacon-hand
 Glows world-wide welcome; her mild eyes command

The air-bridged harbor that twin cities frame.
"Keep, ancient lands, your storied pomp!" cries she
With silent lips. "Give me your tired, your poor,
Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free,
The wretched refuse of your teeming shore.
Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me,
I lift my lamp beside the golden door!"

This poem was written by **Lazarus in 1883** as part of the fund-raising efforts for a base for the Statue of Liberty. It is cast on a plaque that is mounted on the inside of the base of the statue. Lazarus was an activist and advocate for Jewish refugees fleeing from Russian pogroms in the 1800s, and wrote the poem as a way to express empathy for Russian Jewish refugees to the US.

The statue was intended to be a symbol of republican (anti-imperialist) values; however, Lazarus' poem gave it a new purpose, turning it into a symbol of welcome for immigrants and refugees at the front door of the country. (Wikipedia article on "The New Colossus")

Pastor Sarah's Link to her Sermon & Questions for Discussions

1. Luke loves to pair stories to help demonstrate the point that the author is making about Jesus. In this case, we have the story of a Roman centurion paired with the story of a widow. What other parallels can you find in these two stories? What do you think these

parallels (whether similarities or differences) say about Jesus? What do they have to teach us about faith?

2. The centurion has an interesting arc in this story: he requests assistance from Jewish elders to ask Jesus to heal his servant; we find out from the elders that the centurion is faithful, even though he is not Jewish; then, the centurion tells Jesus not to come because he's not worthy to have Jesus in his house, and goes on to talk about what it means to give and receive orders; then Jesus is amazed with his faith, and the servant is healed. It's quite a story! What do you think about the centurion?
3. By contrast, we know very little about the widow. We can make some assumptions about her faith (or lack thereof) because she doesn't seem to have any hope for a miracle, but those are big assumptions to make. Jesus takes the initiative, yet again this week, to provide healing. What does the resurrection of her son mean for her?
4. The phrase "chain of command" carries some connotations for us. What associations did you make when you read that sermon title? What do you think after hearing the sermon?
