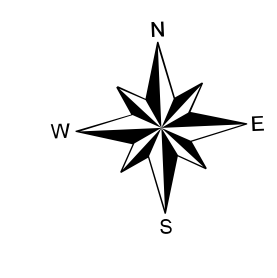

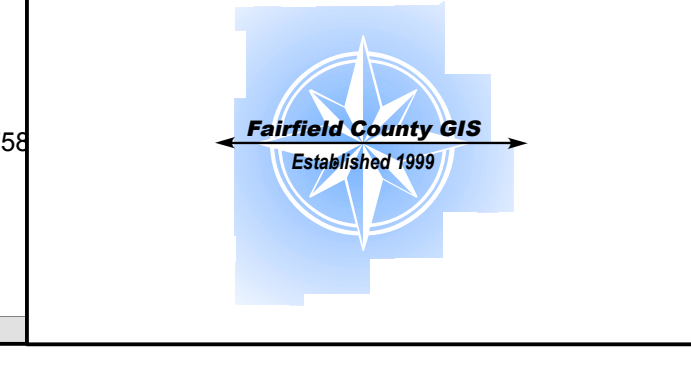

Dedications Lancaster
 Article of agreement made and entered into by and between Ebenezer Zane, of Ohio County and State of Virginia of one part and the purchasers of lots in the town of Lancaster, County of Fairfield Territory Northwest of the River Ohio, now laid off by the said Ebenezer Zane on the East side of Hocking River; Section 1st The lots are to be numbered in squares beginning at the northwest corner of the town, and then alternating from North to South and from South to north, agreeable to the general Draft of the town. Sec 2nd . One-fourth part of the purchase money will be required two weeks from the date of this article. The residue of three-fourths will be required on or before the fourteenth of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and two. To be secured by approved notes bearing lawful interest from the fourteenth of November one thousand eight hundred: Sec 3rd; Square No sixteen including five lots situated in the southeast corner of the town will be and are hereby given to the Trustees of the Town and their successors to be held in trust for a burial ground, a place for erecting a school house, a house of worship, and such other buildings as may be found necessary. All of which to be under the direction of the trustees in the time being given. Also four lots at the intersection of the two main streets running East and West and North and South, known by appellation of the Center Square, are given for the purpose of erecting public buildings not before specified to be under the direction of the trustees of the town as afore said. Sec 4th Possession will be given immediately to purchasers complying with the second section of this Article and when fully complied with the said Ebenezer Zane doth bind himself and his heirs to make a deed in fee simple to the purchasers their heirs and assigns and if the terms be not fully complied with, the lot shall be considered as forfeited and revert again to the original holder. Sec 5th For the convenience of town, one-fourth part of an acre, lying west of lot number -ed two in the square numbered three including two springs will be and are hereby given for the use of its inhabitants to under such regulations as the trustees of the town may think proper. Sec 6th; In consideration of the advantages that arise from the early settlements of Mechanics in the town, and for the encouragement of those who may first settle Lot No 3 in the twentieth square; lot No. 6 in 15th square and No. 6 in the 12th square will be given one to a Blacksmith – one to a house Carpenter and Joiner, and one to a tanner, all of whom are to settle and continue in the Town pursuing their respective trades for the term of four years at which time the aforesaid E. Zane binds himself to make them a deed in fee simple respectively. In testimony of all and singular, the premises, the said Ebenezer Zane by his attorneys Noah + John Zane, hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal, this 14th day of November in the year of our Lord 1800.
