Convention activities will be at Gospel Assembly Church, 4230 N. Oliver. A block of rooms for convention attendees is available at the nearby Aloft hotel, 3642 N. Oliver.

Convention fun begins Friday evening with Singo Bingo—test your knowledge of popular and classic rock/country/pop music! Social hour begins at 7 pm, with bingo from 8 to 9 pm. Come for snacks, fun and fellowship!

Saturday activities include a service project to tie fleece blankets for Wichita Children's Home, elections, and more.

International Director Steven and Lion LeeAnn Middlemiss from New Hampshire will be our guest for the weekend. ID Middlemass will deliver the keynote



address during the Saturday luncheon.

Elections will be held during the business meeting on Saturday.

Voting delegates will elect leaders for the 2025-2026 Lions year, including District Governor, First Vice District Governor and Second Vice District Governor. Clark Lindstrom of Wichita Downtown Lions Club is the candidate for District Governor. Melanie Snider of the Baxter Springs Lions Club is the candidate for First Vice District Governor.

District representatives to the three Kansas foundations—the Kansas Lions Foundation (1 position, 3-year term), the Kansas Lions Band Foundation (2 positions; 2-year term) and the Kansas Lions Sight Foundation (2 positions; 3-year term)—will also be elected.

I will close with a quote by President John F. Kennedy, "We must find time to stop and thank the people who make a difference in our lives."

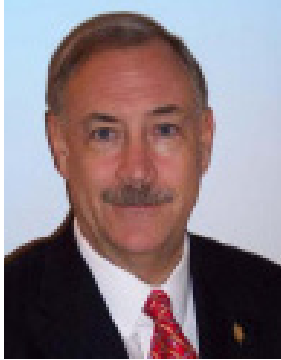

Delegates will also vote on an addition to the By-Laws to add a Leo/Leo-Lion Liaison position to the District Cabinet. This amendment would bring our district by-laws into alignment with Lions International.

The addition is as follows:

## **Article II, Section 11: Leo/ Leo-Lion Cabinet Liaison (Optional position)**

**(k) Support the district Leo chairperson in organizing Leo clubs and members in areas with no Leo Districts.**

**(l) Encourage the formation of a Leo district in areas with the necessary number of clubs and members.**

Voting delegates should provide a completed delegate form (see below) to vote in the election and for the amendment.
