Audit – PCC DeAnne Hersche – Reported that several of the reports have been reviewed and and approved.

Budget and Finance – PDG David Hentges presented the budget for approval. No discussion by the Governors. DG Shari Neidharrdt moved to approve the budget as presented. DG Diana Baumann seconded the motion. Motion was approved 3-0.

Environmental Committee – Committee Chair Ron Weaverling reported that the committee was working very hard on the rules for several contest.

1. Photo Contest.

- It is our intent to increase participation in the photo contest; in terms of total submissions, voting participation, and awards distribution.
- Only DIGITAL PHOTO submissions (taken within Kansas) will be accepted.
- Photo categories will remain the same.
- Lions can now be pictured in the environmental service category photos.
- I will update the photo category sheet with submission deadlines and push it out this week. That will enable districts to include it in district newsletters ASAP.

2. District Photo Contest

District Environmental Chairs will select the district winners in each category and digitally submit them to rwweaverling@gmail.com on a date to be determined.

3. MD17 Photo Contest.

- Voting for the MD17 contest entrants will be conducted online.
- Any MD17 Lion can cast one vote only in each category.
- A Lion can only win in one photo category.
- More to follow on the specifics of this process and the associated dates.
- Winners will be announced at the 2025 Mid Winter Rally (MWR) in Junction City.
- Winners will be recognized and awarded at the 2025 MD17 Convention in Wichita.

4. MD17 Club Level Environmental Project Contest

- It is our intent to encourage more clubs to actively participate in the LCI Environmental global cause within their communities.
- Last year districts N and A, each conducted their own inaugural contests.
- In addition, this year MD17 will host a state wide Club Level Environmental Project Contest.
- Winners will be recognized at the 2025 MD17 Convention in Wichita.

State Office Report - CC Pam Bilyeu

The Kansas Lions State Office has had a number of issues addressed. The broken window has been replaced. PDG Dan, State Secretary had the carpets cleaned prior to the annual Governor's Training/Meeting at the State Office. The West air conditioner unit had the condenser fan motor replaced and the East unit had the control board replaced in the furnace, with other small parts and freon the cost was \$188.80 for the west unit and \$172.05 for the east unit, labor was \$525.00 for a total cost of \$961.40. The cost is being cover by the new maintenance and building fund established by the Council of Governor's. This fund will cover pertinent expenses for building operation.

The new fence also will need a sealant applied to protect the wood with an estimated cost of \$1500.00.

Kansas Lions Foundation Board of Directors meeting August 10, 2024, Windgate by Wyndham, Wichita, Kansas

At 10:06 am President PCC Diane Hentges called the meeting to order. Attending were Lions, Diane Hentges (President); PDG Kathie Bell (Secretary and Director 17-K); PCC Helen LeBlanc (Treasurer and Director 17-N); PCC Randy St. Aubyn (17-K); PDG David Hentges (17-A); Ron Weaverling (17-A); and PDG Richard Caldwell (17-N). Lions Cheryl Kerns (Vice President and Director 17-A); and Linda Falley (17-K) were absent. A quorum was present.

Helen LeBlanc moved the agenda be accepted and Richard Caldwell seconded. The agenda was accepted.

The minutes from the May 31, 2024 meeting had been distributed. David Hentges moved they be approved, and Helen LeBlanc seconded the motion which carried.

Helen LeBlanc gave the Treasurers report. Everything is going well. The books are currently at the auditors. Helen LeBlanc said that she and PDG State Secretary Dan Funke have full access to the checking account. She as Treasurer and Dan Funke as ALERT chair. Cheryl Kerns has limited access for LEOS. Helen LeBlanc moved that her and Dan Funke keep their full access, and Cheryl Kerns and the new ALERT driver gets debit cards. Dan Funke seconded the motion which carried. Kathie Bell moved the Treasurers report be approved and Richard Caldwell seconded the motion. The report was approved.

The ALERT trailer needs to be moved to the Tom and Diane Baumann residence in Hays to be available for new drivers who need approval by the Board. Kathie Bell moved PDG Tom Baumann, PCC Randy St. Aubyn and 1st VDG Lou Morgan be approved as drivers for the ALERT truck with trailer pending vetting their driving records. David Hentges seconded. The motion was approved. Helen LeBlanc and Ron Weaverling moved the ALERT truck and trailer be taken to Hays. The motion carried.

New KLF brochures were handed out at the State Convention. Lion Melanie Schneider made a few minor changes for the next printing which will also have a QR code added.

Helen LeBlanc has custody of the Pink Lion and Bill and Dorothy Wunder pins. They are available from her to the DGs and others who will sell them to Lions in their Districts. Helen Leblanc moved each District Governor be distributed four Pink Lion pins, which they well need to give the KLF proceeds from sales or return the pin(s). Kathie Bell seconded the motion which carried.

PCC DeAnne Heersche gave the QUEST report. The program has been completely revamped. Lions Clubs International has scheduled a Zoom meeting for August 22, 2024 to address these changes. There is in person training at South Haven School from 9am to 1pm on August 26, 2024.

PDG Carleen Rajala gave the Peace Poster report. District chairs are responsible for meeting the poster deadlines. Some of the chairs have Peace Poster kits available for sale.

Diane Hentges has information on First Aid kits the KLF can sell as a fundraiser. There are 40-piece kits that cost about \$30 and automobile kits that would cost KLF \$5 and would retail for \$10. It was the consensus the Foundation sell the smaller kits. Ron Weaverling suggested the KLF do a fundraiser using a grid similar to what some LCIF coordinators use, He plans to do such a fundraiser himself.

Peace Poster Contest 2024 The theme for this year's Peace Poster contest is "Peace Without Limits". Students who are 11,12,or 13 by Nov. 15 are eligible to participate. The district Peace Poster Chairs are to follow the LCI guidelines which include size and submission restrictions. Send the winning poster from each club postmarked no later than Nov. 15 to the District Governor. The DG will select one winning poster from his/her district to send to the Multiple District Council Chairperson. It should be postmarked no later than Dec. 1st. Please include a 6 x 8 picture of the artist. The poster chosen as the Multiple District 17 winner will be submitted to International Headquarters by Dec. 15th. All 3 of the individual district winners will be invited to attend the Kansas Lion Foundation's Youth Luncheon at Mid-Winter Rally.
