Zone Chairs are the field leaders for Clubs in our district. They serve club leaders by communicating information about services and support from the district and multiple district (State) to clubs. Zone Chairs also let the District Governor know of any needs where the District can provide support or serve as a resource. (Training, Guiding Lions, Answers and help with service reporting).

Zone Chairpersons are charged with visiting clubs in their zone and scheduling a zone meeting with their clubs following the District Cabinet meetings. Clubs gain valuable information and share ideas with other club presidents, secretaries, vice presidents and their Lions members. Often these club stories of services performed and fundraising projects are the most impactful benefit of attending the Zone Meetings. Plus stay up to date on important dates, news about band camp, peace poster contest, learning opportunities and leadership development. Plus enjoy getting to know fellow leaders.

Zone meeting are typlically hosted by a club in the zone (an opportunity to provide food that can be a fundraiser for the club). Meetings of the Clubs in the Zone can be hosted by a local club or held in public meeting place as space allows or restaurant.

When a zone chair seeks to visit your club please make them feel welcome as they are essential to the governor team. Learning the needs that communities have that Lions can address. Examples: District and Club Community Impact Grant, District or multiple district membership incentive programs, and use of the Spot Screeners or other resources shared by clubs in the District, or how to accept donations using the 501 c,3 status of the Kansas Lions Foundation.


