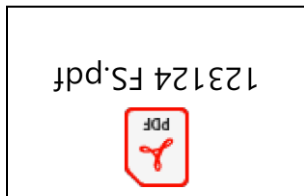

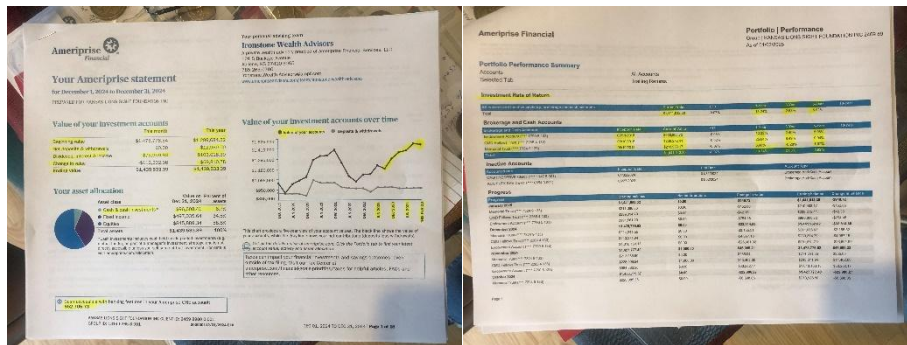

KLSF Report Used Eyeglass program

MD17 Eyeglass Collection Chair Michael Sundstrom

December is here and boy has it been cold at the storage location this month.

We just got 16k pairs of glasses in from Wichita and we are getting full. I sent 4 or 5 big box flat bundles back down with all the small flat box bundles we had. I now need to source these boxes and find the lead time to obtain them.

I emailed Indiana Lions to coordinate a visit to collect our sorted glasses. More to follow as I expect this to happen in late Jan. or early Feb. We have room but a few more months of collections and we will be full again.

I expect with a larger facility we wouldn't need to have as many trips from Indiana. I might need to discuss this space issue. Because I'm going to be ordering box flats (large and small) which I'll fill up half of the room with this stock. Room, I don't have right now.

The District Governor has been great with the distribution of the eyeglass collection boxes during all her visits to the clubs. DG Margy has handed out 3 or 4 boxes at each club visit. I have asked the 1st VDG and the 2nd VDG to also keep the eyeglass collection boxes while attending there visits around the district.

State Fair – Vern Failor (Director's, please help and collect gloves. He needs small, medium, large, and x-large) Note: one size fits all doesn't work.

Old Business:

Welch Allyn RetinaVue 700 Screener (for adults) Update – Deb stated we will be researching this further. On Monday, January 13th a Zoom Meeting was scheduled with Maryellen Okeefe-Smith of School Health. She talked about the screener providing valuable information regarding how to use the screener and the advantages of the screener. We asked many questions; she had good answers. Knowing we had concerns; she stated the Oklahoma Lions are having great success with this screener and also the Syracuse NY Lions. She provided information for the Oklahoma Lions and Syracuse Lions; Deb has reached out but has not heard back from either to date. We expect to have meetings in the near future to pursue the RetinaVue 700 screener. To provide a screener for all three districts totaled \$37,800 (\$11,325 for screener and \$1,275 for a one-year support). Additional equipment such as a stand for the screener, Maryellen quoted \$1200 per stand. Another concern is the need for a professional to read the results of the test. More information will be provided at our next meeting.

Knight of Sight Pins – Terry Weldin has the pins and Treasurer Andy will notify him when pins need to be sent out to individuals. A donation of \$100 to KLSF.

Fundraiser Idea's – discussed a Broom and Mop program, no one seemed interested. We need to have a fundraiser, if you have idea's please share.

KLSF Brochure Completed – Deb; brochures were provided to DG's and Vern for the State Fair. A digital copy was emailed to the DG's, 1VDG's, 2VDG's, and CC. Deb will email a digital copy KLSF Lions.

Polo Shirts for Foundation Lions: DG Margy Sundstrom volunteered to do research on this. Little interest was expressed by director who were present. Deb believes the foundation should have polo's or shirts.

Scholarships Update - Dr. Steven Cauble stated that this was moving along with the Kansas Optometric Association starting to accept names of applicants for the scholarships. He will report to the foundation as two (2) students are selected to receive the scholarships. Remember, these scholarships are being paid by the funds received for the Solar Eclipse Glasses. Gene recognized Dr. Krug and Dr. William Witt for their valuable monetary support in the 2023-24 Solar Eclipse Program. Gene also stated an Optometric Scholarship in his name has been established with the Kansas Optometric Association. Dr. Bill Witt will also have a scholarship established in his name but is unable to be with us today. Deb will present Dr. Witt with his plaque and Lions International Presidential Certificate/LI President's pin at his club meeting.

PID Gene was recognized for his many years of service as President of KLSF. Deb presented Gene with a beautiful wooden box and LI Presidential Certificate w/LI President's pin. Gene thanked the foundation.
