This was a fake email sent using correct email addresses for both TO and FROM but the company name and address did not exist.

So be careful where you send your Diabetes Camp money. The best thing to do is contact me by phone to let me know what your intentions are and I will ok the transaction. I am not publishing my phone number or email address as all of you know how to find them.

Pursuant to By-Laws Article XI—Amendments, Sections 1 and 2—Amending Procedure and Notice, the District Constitution and By-Laws (C&BL) Committee will submit the following Resolution to the 2026 District Convention to be held in Manhattan, Kansas on April 11, 2026:

Proposed Amendment – Vote Yes or No

Be it Resolved that Article IV—District Committees, Section 12—District Cabinet Committees, Paragraph B be amended by adding Beverly Nichols Reading Action and placing it between “ALERT” and “Campus Clubs Extension” in the list of committees.

EXPLANATION

Paragraph A of Article IV, Section 12 gives the District Governor authority to appoint committees and name their chairpersons.

Paragraph B of said Section reads, in part: District Cabinet Committees may include but are not limited to . . . This is followed by over 20 named committees, none of which is Reading Action. Committees are listed in alphabetical order in Paragraph B. The word “Committee” following the name, although not included, is assumed.

In January, 2025, under the provision of Paragraph A, then-District Governor Margy Sundstrom appointed a Reading Action Program Committee. She asked the District Cabinet to approve renaming it to “Beverly Nichols Reading Action Program.” To provide consistency of format, the C&BL Committee recommends dropping “Program” from the committee name, leaving the name Beverly Nichols Reading Action, with “Committee” assumed to follow, as with all other committees in the list.

Jackson County Lions Club to receive charter

In the summer of 2024, Holton resident Terry Weldin announced the formation of a new Lions Club that would serve Jackson County, six years after the Holton Lions Club disbanded, the new club getting some assistance from Lions in Sabetha.

On Saturday, Feb. 21, the new Jackson County Lions Club will be chartered as a stand-alone entity at a special ceremony to be held at the Jackson County Senior Center, and anyone who would like to be a part of the special event is encouraged to contact Weldin and make a reservation by this Friday, Feb. 13.

"We don't want to come up short of food," said Weldin, who noted that a dinner will be served as part of the Feb. 21 chartering ceremony.

It's the culmination of a group effort to get a new Lions Club started to serve all of Jackson County after members of Holton's club announced in



the spring of 2018 that the club would disband later that year after 80 years of existence due to a decline in membership.

"This is not the first Lions Club I've chartered," said Weldin, who helped establish a club in his former hometown of Burlington back in 1995 and who noted that the new Jackson County club plans to expand its services to the county beyond free vision screenings for children and recycling of "soft plastic" items.

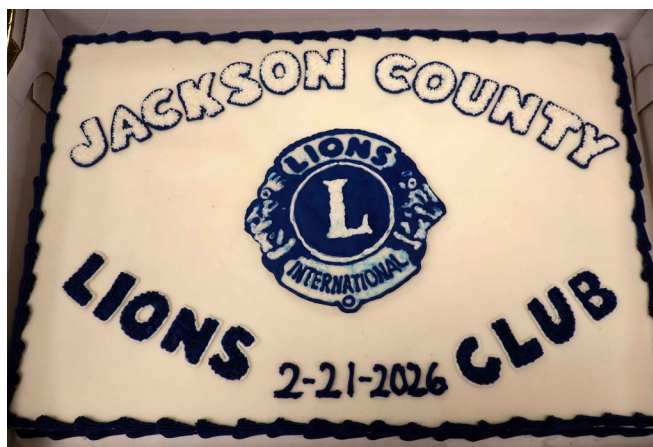

The new Jackson County Lions Club was first announced in September of 2024 as a branch of the Sabetha Lions Club, with members of the Sabetha club joining efforts with former Holton Lions to form the new club. At present, Weldin said there are 22 members of the Jackson County club, and monthly club meetings are being conducted online.

"The Jackson County club is now separate from the Sabetha club, and we thank them for supporting this effort to grow a complete Lions Club in Jackson County," Weldin said. "We did joint projects with the Sabetha club by doing free Lions vision screenings in Nemaha County, as well as other Sabetha club activities."

Jackson County's club went from being a branch of the Sabetha club to becoming its own club at the recommendation of Topeka-based District Governor Irene Haws.

"She was very important in helping us complete the conversion from the branch club to the full club," Weldin said of Haws. "We could not have done it without District Gov-

ernor Irene... She knows what she's doing."

In addition to continuing free vision screenings and "soft plastic" recycling, Weldin said the club wants to work closer with the county's three school districts, with one particular project involving getting high school musicians to participate in the annual Kansas Lions State Band Camp.

"We have sent one student from Holton already, but that's something we aspire to do with all the schools," he said. "We're hoping to get more than just a few from each school to go. It would be a good start to get one student from each school."

For younger students, ages 11 through 13, the club is also sponsoring participation in the Lions Club International Peace Poster Contest, which Weldin said had also been a project of the Holton Lions Club.

"They weren't doing it at a county-wide level," he said. "So we've reached out to Holton Middle School, and we'll be reaching out to Jackson Heights and Royal Valley as well to see if they'd be in-

terested in participating."

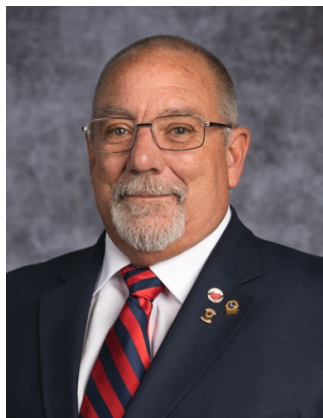
Keynote Speaker for the Convention:
