Lions 17-K Kids Chemo Care Bag Project





LCIF

Melvin Jones Fellowships (MJF) and Progressive MJF (PMJF)

Melvin Jones Fellowships are the highest honor bestowed by Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). A donation of \$1,000 (lump sum or aggregate installments) is required for a MJF or every increment of PMJF. Donations can come from the club treasury, personal funds, or non-Lion sources. If a MJF donation application by an individual Lion is completed properly, that Lion's club, district, and multiple district also receive credit for the donation.

Accompanying the initial MJF is a beautifully engraved plaque. MJFs are typically presented by clubs to honor a long time Lion with distinguished service to the club. A MJF can also be presented to non-Lions who provide exceptional service or support for Lions.

Most PMJFs are provided to Lions after they receive an initial MJF and who continue to support LCIF with personal donations. There are 54 levels of PMJF; the highest level represents aggregate donations of \$91,000 or greater.

We currently have 1,598 MJF and 106 PMJF recipients in the Kansas.

When clubs or individual Lions make donations of less than \$1,000, those funds are held by LCIF in "accounts" for the clubs and individuals until subsequent donations are made to total \$1,000. At that point, a Lion or club can request presentation of a MJF or next higher level of PMJF. In Kansas, we have over \$400,000 in MJF installment funds at LCIF. That represents approximately 400 MJF/PMJF levels that could be presented if efforts were made to utilize the funds.

During these last months of the Lions fiscal year would be a great time for a club to increase its club balance to \$1,000 to honor a deserving Lion while helping Kansas Lions reach their LCIF goal of \$119,869 by June 2022. Note that donations made in June might not be processed in time to be reflected in this year's total. Recommend be made donations NLT mid-May (preferably end of April) to help ensure processing by June 30th. Similarly, individual Lions with installment balances could make a final donation to complete their MJF or next higher PMJF. Club members with small balances that do not desire or expect to ever complete donations for MJFs/PMJFs may transfer their balances to help their club aggregate enough funds for MJF/PMJF presentations.

I or your District Co-Coordinators or District Governors can provide installment status to any club or individual wishing to honor someone with MJFs/PMJFs.

While we are mostly focused on service to our local communities, we are proud of the myriad charitable projects our Foundation does for the greater world-wide community. Your MJF/PMJF presentations are a highly visible reminder of the amazing things we accomplish across the globe.

Kindness matters, and we can show that by supporting our Foundation.

Lions International has designated eight global causes. These are Childhood Cancer, Diabetes, Disaster Relief, Environment, Humanitarian, Hunger, Vision and Youth. Most of the community service projects done by Lions further one or more of the global causes.

Now is a good time to plan service projects for your club to do this Spring. In addition to continuing the service projects that your club is known for, I would like to challenge every Lions club to sponsor at least one new project. Here are a few ideas for you:

February 15 was *International Childhood Cancer Day* – Although that date was last week, February is a good month to do something for childhood cancer. You could make care packages for children receiving cancer treatment, provide funds for families to travel to treatment, etc.

April 22 is Earth Day – You could plant trees, clean up a park, or pick up trash along a highway.

May 28 is World Hunger Day – May would be a good month to do s project related to hunger. Sponsor a food drive for your local food bank. Take backpacks full of food and snacks to your school for children who don't get enough to eat at home.

I hope your club will take advantage of some of these opportunities to expand your service offerings. Doing more service raises your club's profile in the community and helps to recruit members. We need members to do more service, and more service encourages members to join us.

As a state, we've done two service projects at Council Meetings this year. At the October meeting, we made gift bags for children stricken with cancer which included a Halloween card, a toy, and sugar-free candy. These bags were taken to Children's Mercy Hospital in Topeka.

At Mid-Winter Rally we collected a lot of snacks at boxed them up to be shipped to active-duty soldiers all over the world. Additionally, we collected socks for veterans and each DG took them to Veterans Center in their district.

We are also planning a project to do at our District Convention which will be held in Liberal April 11-12. We hope to see as many of you there as possible.

Please make sure that your secretary is reporting all service projects to Lions International. Reported service helps attract grants and donations to allow us to more and larger service projects.
