It is known that some of us shy away from technology. That's understandable. So, there is help for clubs to report the wonderful services the clubs of District 17A do for their communities. There is the SARs Card, a small business card size form. Information needed is the name of the club, person reporting with contact information; this goes on one side. On the other side the information is simple...what, where, when hours of service, number of volunteers, and number of people served. Simple!

Ok, what do you do with the card? Again simple, mail it to the District secretary or district administrator to enter into the LCI system. 38% reporting can hopefully now be 83% reporting by the end of June.

Sponsored by the Sunflower Lions Club of Topeka Several years ago, the Washington Lions Club decided the club wanted to be involved in a city park improvement. The club decided to inquire about replacing the east shelter house in the south end of the city park.

The original shelter houses included a kitchen area. The city wanted to eliminate the old kitchens that were obsolete and look in to other improvements. The new shelter house includes a serving counter with three electrical outlets and LED lighting. Wiring was completed by Corey Tegethoff.

Washington Lions Club recently completed a project in the south city park of tearing down and building a new shelter house this fall. In August, the east old shelter house was torn down by City of Washington employees, and the new shelter was built by Wolfgang Construction of Manhattan/Wamego identical to the north shelter houses. Kyle Wolfgang is a former resident of Washington.

This has been an on-going project for Washington Lions for the past three years. Fundraising started with a family who wanted to contribute towards the project for the community. Other fundraising activities has included softball tournaments and raffles. In May, 2023, the Washington County Community Foundation awarded a grant of \$1,000 for the shelter house project from the Washington County Opportunity Fund. Washington Lions would like to extend their gratitude towards the local foundation, individuals and businesses, those who attended softball tournaments and purchased raffle tickets, and the City of Washington for their support for this project. A cedar sign designating the Washington Lions Club as the donor was created by TimberStruck Woodworks. Future plans may include improvements to the park benches and tables in the shelter.

Thanks to the City of Washington, the Washington County Community Foundation, and donors who made this project happen.




