- 1. After our in-person Lion Portal training on August 30th, we've had 11 club representatives attend either in-person or virtual. GLT Coordinator PDG Dr. Vania Castro will schedule other training opportunities and provide information on how to get training credit by watching the recorded session (to be uploaded) on the District web site.
- 2. Every club is (or will be) conducting community service. So far, 26 clubs have entered service and fundraising information on the Lion Portal. Thank you to those that have.
- 3. Remember that every Lion can set up an account to enter the Lion Portal. Every Lion can input initial information for a service/fundraising project in the Portal. Only the club President, Secretary, Club Administrator, and Service Chairperson have the authority to report a project complete and report the results to LCI. Another reason to have a Club Administrator to assist with some of the digital workload.
- 4. The Portal shows service activities for the current and prior 2 fiscal years. If clubs started a report and never completed them and reported the data to LCI, that data will never be recorded and used by LCI. Those drafts will fall off after 2 cycles of fiscal years and the data lost.
- 5. A question was asked at the recent training session about a capability to download the service reports so they can be shared with club members. I'm researching that and will provide feedback later.
- 6. Remember that I have the capability to enter or correct data for your club in the Portal, if you wish. I will also be glad to assist you on the phone or a Zoom meeting if you need help. If you cannot attend any of the in-person or virtual training session scheduled by PDG Vania, I will provide one-on-one training for you at our convenience.




